

Ecotype	Cascades at high elevations, Oregon Columbia River Gorge at low elevations ¹⁰ .
Propagation Goal	Grows well with cuttings ²
Propagation Method	Seed ⁴
	Fall- direct sow outdoors
	Winter- sow in vented containers, cold frame or
	unheated greenhouse
	Indoors - stratify if sowing indoors ⁴
Product Type	Bareroot (field grown) seeds
Stock Type	Seed ¹⁰
Time to Grow	Seed to flowering 2-3 years ¹⁰
Target Specifications	Under 15 cm, 6 inches ⁴
Propagule Collection Instructions	remove and collect seeds when seed heads are dry on plants ⁴
Propagule Processing/Propagule Characteristics	Sow seed densely seed germination is low ¹⁰
Pre-Planting Propagule Treatments	When cleaning many seeds may be small and infertile Richard has tried cold stratification over winter (starting in late October/ early November) ¹⁰
Growing Area Preparation / Annual	Medium water, part shade, low CaCO3 tolerance ²
Practices for Perennial Crops	Full sun, partial shade ⁴
	Trough culture ⁶ can grow in soilless mixture
Establishment Phase Details	2-4 weeks $(64-71^{\circ}\text{F})^5$
	Supplemental water if planting in spring. ¹⁰
Length of Establishment Phase	(24-39°F) ⁵ 2-3 months
	some seed will not germinate until the following year ¹⁰
Active Growth Phase	Roots in fall, top growth late winter to early summer ¹⁰ (41-53°F) ⁵
Length of Active Growth Phase	Summer/spring
Hardening	Unknown
Length of Hardening Phase	Unknown

Harvesting, Storage and Shipping	Keep in cold temperature	
Length of Storage	Seed cold stratification for 2 or 3 months ¹⁰
