🖉 <u>Creating a Low-maintenance garden</u> 🛷

This plant collection is for everyone out there that would love a pristine garden that attracts wildlife; but you just don't have the time to keep it apart from a the odd pruning session and a mowing of the lawn. Low maintenance plants for pollinators has you covered. This collection of plants contains lots of flowering shrubs as well as perennials and bulbous plants that should come back year on year without the need for much watering, dead-heading or other attention.








Planting

Just as with any other type of garden, layering in a low maintenance garden is still important but may be more-shrub heavy than traditional borders. Begin with plenty of shrubs and then add a mixture of perennials such as penstemons, lychnis, oriental poppies and phlox to the centre of the border. In the autumn you can plant snowdrops, grape hyacinths and tulips for a pop of colours in the spring. These bulbous flowers should keep coming back and some, like grape hyacinths, will spread and form a carpet of flowers in the spring. However, if you do not have the space for a border with perennials and bulbs, or wish to have a smaller green area, a mixture of shrubs can be planted and will have a great impact in their own right. Try Hypericum, Abelia or Weigela for maximum impact in a medium sized-shrub. If you are happy to wait a little longer for results, small trees such as crab apples, snowy mespilus or golden chains can be perfect for this type of garden.



Some of the plants listed in our Top 200 are not fully hardy in all or some parts of the United Kingdom.

Plants without a thermometer symbol are fully hardy in the severest UK Winter; equating to **H5** or hardier.

Plants with a coloured thermometer symbol are hardy to varying degrees as follows:

Pollinators


Our data on pollinators has been collected from studies spanning over a decade. Pollinator symbols appear when plants are proven to be good nectar plants for certain insects.

It should be noted that all bee and hoverfly data is ours but lepidoptera data is taken from Butterfly Conservation.

Our data spans a wide range of different insect species. For simplicity, these species have been condensed into six easy icons to represent them:

a) Honeybees c) Bumblebees e) Moths

b) Hoverflies d) Butterflies f) Solitary Bees (Includes Moths)
