£3.00	Achillea x 'King Edward'	First rate alpine, flowering for ages with soft primrose yellow blooms. Only 4" high.
£3.00	Achillea ageratifolia	Close, silvery pad with 3" stems of large, white flowers. Trough or scree in full sun. Uncommon.
£3.00	Acinos alpinus	Alpine herb forming small mound. Lots purple-pink labiate flrs. in Summer. Dry scree/ sun.
£4.00	Adiantum venustum	Totally hardy Maidenhair Fern, from Himalayas. Enjoys cool, shady spot, with leafy compost.
£4.00	Adonis brevistyla	Uncommon. Large, glistening white daisies with an ice-blue reverse, giving crystal-like effect.
£3.00	Allium acuminatum	North American species, approx. 7" high, with umbels of lrg. reddish-pink flowers. Full sun.
£4.00	Allium beesianum	The true species, rarely seen. 8" stems, topped with nodding heads of large sky blue bells.
£4.00	Allium cernuum 'Dwarf White'	Wonderful, new introduction. Free flowering, at Only 7" high. Superior to pink forms.
£4.00	Allium insubricum	Very special, slow to reach flwrg. size, dusky pink, thimble sized bells hang from 8" stems.
£4.00	Allium narcissiflorum	The true plant. A deep purplish pink form, with many heads of nodding bells. Bulks up well.
£3.00	Allium sikkimensis	Neat rockery species at only 7" with deep royal blue heads. One of very best for alpine gardens.
£3.00	Allium thunbergii	Last alpine to flower on Nursery, at only 6". Round, pink globes, Oct - November. Japan.
£3.00	Andromeda polifolia 'Blue Ice'	Forming open globe of bluish-grey, narrow leaves. Many soft pink flowers. Sheltered site.
£3.00	Androsace carnea 'Brigantica'	Compact 'Thrift like' mound with short stems of white flowers in April. A classy, easy alpine.
£3.50	Androsace rotundifolia	An easy species, with rounded leaves and endless show of soft pink globose heads. Sun.
£3.00	Androsace lanuginosa	Silvery haired rosettes, form gentle cascade ending in light pink flowers in mid summer.
£3.00	Androsace strigillosa	Large rosette at ground level, with stems 5-6" high. Topped with many pale pink flowers.
£3.50	Androsace studiosorum	A good form, with large pink flowers in June. Easy alpine for crevice gardens or troughs.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Blue Bonnet'	Seldom offered selection, mid blue flowers pre spring. Slow growing special for shade.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Flore Pleno'	Finer leafed and slower growing than A. Vestal. Flowers are more or less fully double centred.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Leed's Variety'	Giant flowered form of native wood anemone. Vigorous grower, leafy soils in part shade.
£4.00	Anemone nemorosa 'Royal Blue'	Large flowers of a good strong blue. A dramatic addition for leafy shade. Slow spreader.
£4.00	Anemone x lipsiensis (syn seemannii)	Beautiful, pale yellow hybrid, between A. ranunculoides and native wood anemone.

£4.00	Anemone nemorosa x 'Vestal'	Double pom-pom centres on this classic w/land Anemone. Mid-late spring, Free flwrg. Special.
£3.00	Anemone nemorosa x 'Virescens'	Unusual sport. Ferny green bracts instead of flowers. Very decorative for shaded woodland.
£3.00	Anemone palmata lutea	One of many names for A. magellanica. Our form has strong vanilla yellow colour. 10" high
£3.00	Anemone ranunculoides	A little carpenter for moist shade. Masses of buttercup yellow flrs, then delicate bronzy fol.
£3.00	Anemone ranunculoides 'Semi Plena'	A little misleading, as the large, golden flowers not really double. Still. A good doer.
£4.00	Anemone sylvestris 'Flore Pleno'	Quite a rare item. Flowers so double, they form almost a pom-pom. Groundcover at only 4" ht.
£3.50	Anemone trullifolia	Good sized flowers of rich blue, late spring, 3" high. Ours are 3-4 yr. old plants. Himalayas.
£4.50	Anemonopsis macrophylla	Beautiful woodlander. 2' high stems, with several large, waxy nodding lanterns, palest pink.
£3.00	Antennaria dioica 'Rubra'	A superb combination. Red button flwrs. above silvery mat. Lovely over rocks and gravel.
£3.00	Aquilegia alpina	This is the true plant of the Alps. Although alpine, it reaches 18" high. Violet blue flowers.
£3.00	Aquilegia flabellata 'Cameo'	A beautiful miniature with soft, baby pink flowers and cream cup. Only 7" high.
£3.00	Arabis blepharophylla 'Spring Charm'	Our plants are grown from good, deep red clone, to maintain a vibrant colour. March – May.
£3.50	Arenaria festucoides	A close, grassy mat from the Himalayas, with stemless white flowers. Best slightly moist.
£4.00	Arisaema flavum var abbreviatum	A miniature form, only 4-5" high, with plain green leaves and yellow ochre, hooded spathe.
£3.00	Armeria juniperifolia 'Alba'	One of the easiest and best trough plants. Tight mound, pure white Thrift flrs. in early spring.
£3.00	Armeria juniperifolia 'Bevan's Form'	Tight dome radiating many deep pink 'Thrift' flrs. over fairly long period. Great trough plant.
£3.00	Armeria maritima 'Vesuvius'	New Thrift with vibrant red flowers over a long period. Darkest bronzy foliage.
£3.00	Arum italicum 'Chameleon'	Excellent woodlander, with beautifully marked leaves splashed with cream. Spathe, also cream.
£3.00	Asperula nitida	Thin, needle-like leaves, on this bluish tinged cushion – hidden below mass of pale red flowers
£3.00	Aster alpinus 'Dark Beauty'	Large, deep violet blue daisies on 6" stems. Enjoys perfect drainage in full sun. Eur. Alps.
£3.50	Astilbe chinensis pumila 'Tiny Form'	Perfect 6" miniature of this species Astilbe, which we have long cultivated. V. uncommon
£3.50	Astilbe crispa 'Perkeo'	Species with very short, stiff leaves and 6" spikes of radiant pink flowers.
£3.50	Astilbe glaberrima saxatilis	The smallest species, hails from Mts. of Japan. 2" stems of cream flrs. emerge from close mat.
£3.50	Astilbe glaberrima 'William Buchanan'	A true miniature, with darkest green leaves and short sprays of white flowers in abundance.
£3.50	Astilbe simplicifolia 'Inshriach Pink'	Must be the best flowering dwarf Astilbe for alpine gardens. Many pink flrs, bronzy foliage.

£4.00	Dryas x suendermannii	German hybrid with large white flowers, grown for its floriferous habit and ease of cultivation.
£3.00	Aubretia 'Bressingham Red'	The best red to date of this easy, yet valuable addition to rockery. Flowers in spring.
£3.00	Aubrieta marginata 'Valerie'	Bright gold variegation to the compact rosettes. Light lavender blue flowers. Uncommon.
£3.00	Aubrieta marginata variegata	Literally, a cushion of constant flowering habit. Cream variegation, pale blue flrs. Uncommon.
£3.50	Bergenia cordifolia 'Tubby Andrews'	The only variegated leafed Bergenia. Flwrg. in high summer, with rosy pink bells. Uncommon.
£4.00	Brachyglottis bidwillii	This is a totally hardy form of this evergreen dwarf shrub from N.Z. Leathery, pewter leaves.
£3.00	Brimeura amethystina	Lilliputian hyacinth with elfin bells of white or blue, on arching 6" stems. From European Alps.
£3.00	Calceolaria falklandica	Tough species from that windswept Island. Good size flowers for carpeting in damp shade.
£3.50	Caltha palustris 'Alba'	Himalayan form of our 'Marsh Marigold'. Large flrs, almost like xmas roses early as Mar.
£3.00	Caltha palustris ssp minor	Tiny Marsh Marigold growing as rarity in Scottish Mnts. only 2" high. Likes moisture!
£3.00	Campanula garganica 'Dickson's Gold'	There couldn't possibly be a better gold leafed alpine! Contrasts well with the sky blue flowers
£3.50	Campanula nitida 'Alba'	Attractive, glossy evergreen rosettes, on compact mound. Huge white, waxy saucers, in summer.
£3.00	Campanula pulla	A lush green mound, producing short stems of large violet bells throughout summer.
£3.00	Cardamine heptaphylla	Seldom seen beauty for the woodland bed. Lightly scented, cream flowers, approx. 2' high
£3.00	Cardamine pratensis 'Flora Plena'	Showy, double pink sport of the native Cuckoo Flower, for moist soil. No bad vices.
£3.00	Cardamine trifolium	Leathery, glossy leaves at ground level. 3" high stems of white flowers from March – April.
£3.00	Cardamine waldsteinii	An uncommon woodland species forming low mat of leaves and short sprays of lg. white flrs.
£3.00	Carex bergrenii	A very tidy, high alpine from N.Z. forming neat bronzy mound, for rock garden. Site not too dry.
£3.00	Centaurea simplicicaulis	Wavy edged, silvery foliage at ground level. Stems to 9" high, of mauve Cornflowers. Sun.
£3.00	Chaenorhinum glareosum	Slow growing low pad, of rounded leaves, completely covered in lilac flowers. Full sun.
£3.00	Chaistophyllum oppositifolium	A well-known alpine with succulent leaves and pendulous Laburnum-like chains.
£3.00	Clematis x petrei 'Lunar Lass'	Gently cascading hybrid, with greenish-yellow small flowers along thin stems. Good pot var.
£4.00	Clematis marmoraria	Forming an open cushion of parsley-like foliage. Many creamy yellow blooms. Trough or scree.
£4.00	Colchicum agrippinum	Rare Turkish species, only 6". Characteristic chequered goblets of dusky rose colour.
£4.00	Colchicum speciosum	Autumn wouldn't be the same without the huge pink goblets thrusting through fallen leaves.

£4.50	Colchicum speciosum 'Album'	Stunning. Huge white goblets in early autumn. Our clone builds up reasonably quickly.
£3.00	Commelina dianthifolia	Hardy species from high alt. California. Small Tradescantia like flrs. of deepest royal blue. 9"
£3.00	Convallaria majalis	Sweetly scented Lily of the Valley for moist shade. Good ground cover for trouble spots.
£4.00	Convallaria majalis 'Albostriata'	Very slow growing, with thin gold striations to the leaf. A special and well behaved woodlander.
£4.00	Convallaria majalis 'Hardwick Hall'	A robust 'Lily of the Valley' with dark green leaves, edged with cream. Scented flrs. in May.
£4.00	Convallaria majalis 'Rosea'	The pink Lily of the Valley, slower to establish, But colour becomes deeper as plants mature.
£4.00	Cornus canadensis	Well known groundcover for its large cream sepals late spring. Fantastic red autumn colour.
£3.00	Corydalis solida 'George Baker'	Invaluable for its striking red flowers, when Snowdrops are the only early blooms in garden.
£3.00	Corydalis x 'Heavenly Blue'	Special new hybrid, between C. Elata and C. Flexuosa. Stronger and shorter stems, sky blue.
£3.00	Corydalis x 'Kingfisher'	Very special hybrid between C. Cashmeriana x C. Elata. Compact, long flwrg. if grown in shade
£4.00	Corydalis malkensis	Similar to solida, but earlier, with cream flowers from early march. Rarely seen in gardens.
£4.00	Corydalis tauricola	Very early riser, producing many cream flowers, with almost black lip. Makes a good show plant.
£3.00	Cotoneaster thymefolia	A very tough clone of this evergreen, tiny leafed shrub. Masses small red berries, autumn-spring.
£3.50	Crocosmia 'Dusky Maiden'	Late autumn variety, sporting bronzy foliage, topped with coppery-russet blooms. Ht. 2'
£3.00	Crocosmia 'Phillipa Browne'	Vigorous, clump forming variety with emerald green leaves, and vibrant coppery-orange flws.
£4.00	Cyclamen cilicium	Autumn flwrg. and early enough when grown in sheltered woodland or in cold glasshouse.
£4.00	Cyclamen coum	Stunning leaf forms on hardy pre-Spring Cyc. Add leaf mould to moist soil. Pink/ white/reds.
£4.00	Cyclamen coum 'Nyman's Strain'	Most beautiful of all coum hybrids. Mostly silver foliage, with reddish/magenta flowers.
£4.00	Cyclamen coum 'Tile Barn Elizabeth'	Free-flowering, pure silver leafed hybrid. Flrs. are deep pink, wth paler picottee edge. Early.
£3.00	Cyclamen hederifolium (mixed colours)	Best known hardy Cyclamen, our stock plants give good deep pinks and superior leaf form.
£4.00	Cyclamen hederifolium Long Leaf forms	Special seedlings of our finest saggitate, almost aroid, shaped leaves. Colours vary, whites/pinks.
£4.00	Cyclamen hederifolium 'Silver Cloud'	A special cultivar. Pure silver, unmarked leaves, pink flowers. Looks amazing in shade.
£4.00	Cyclamen hederifolium 'White Cloud'	Pure silver leaves, with white flowers in autumn. Dramatic combination for shade.
£4.00	Cyclamen intaminatum	Truly miniature, hardy species. Round glossy leaves and small white flrs. Seldom offered.
£5.00	Cyclamen libanoticum	Rare species, from Mts. of the Lebanon. Hardy in cold glasshouse. Lrg. white flws, red blotch.
£4.00	Cyclamen pseudibericum	Rarely offered. Large magenta blooms late Feb. One of showiest species, best in cold g'house.

£4.00	Cyclamen repandum 7cm pots	Can be grown in Scotland, given deep leafy compost, in sheltered shade. Reddish-pink.
£5.00	Cyclamen purpurascens	Totally hardy, evergreen, summer flwrg. Very special species with scent of Lily of the Valley.
£3.00	Daboecia scotica 'Jack Drake'	Smallest growing 'Irish Heath', with deep ruby bells in abundance. Suits ericaeous trough.
£5.00	Dactylorhiza hybrids	These are various coloured seedlings, grown on nursery, over many years. Robust and tough.
£3.00	Delphinium cashmerianum	Not to be confused with short-lived types. Stocky plant, 16" high. Large violet, hooded flrs.
£3.00	Dianthus 'Annette'	Striking blue foliage, on this compact dome. 2" stems semi double, blood red flowers. Scented.
£3.00	Dianthus erinaceus alpinus	The 'Hedgehog' Dianthus, forming a close, prickly cushion with short stems of pink flrs.
£3.50	Dianthus glacialis	Very close, high alpine cushion for trough or scree garden. Sharp drainage, in full sun.
£3.00	Dianthus arenarius 'Little Maiden'	Small compact cushion, ideal for troughs, etc. Short sprays white, ragged edged, fragrant flrs.
£3.00	Dianthus 'Freda Woodliffe'	Uncommon, new hybrid with blue foliage and 4" stems of single, stark pink, scented flowers.
£3.00	Dianthus alpinus 'Inshriach Dazzler'	Well named rockery Pink, with most vivid shade of deep pink flowers.
£3.00	Dianthus 'La Bourboulle'	Close hummock of blue-green leaves with short stems of highly fragrant pink flowers.
£3.00	Dianthus myrtinervis (ruby form)	Lush green dome, radiating 3" stems deep pink flowers during spring.
£3.00	Dianthus 'Nywood's Cream'	One of the best compact alpine hybrids for scent. Short stems of cream flowers in summer.
£3.00	Dianthus pavonius	A wonderful species for rock garden. Ground hugging, smothered in deep pink flowers. Alps.
£3.00	Dianthus 'Whatfield Magenta'	Neat mound of attractive blue foliage, a dramatic contrast to the strong magenta flowers
£3.00	Dicentra cucularia	Finely dissected, smoky grey foliage, with 4" stems of white lockets in early spring.
£3.00	Dodecatheon meadia	'Shooting Stars' for spring display in part shade. Cyclamen-like blooms in April.
£4.00	Dryas x suendermannii	German hybrid with large white flowers, grown for its floriferous habit and ease of cultivation.
£4.00	Epimedium grandiflorum 'Lilafee' (Lilac Fairy)	Violet flowers of good size. A superb hybrid of compact growth, only 8" high.
£3.00	Epimedium x alpinum x grandiflorum 'Rubrum'	Delicate grower. Thin stems, topped with light red flowers in late Spring. Slow to spread.
£4.00	Epimedium grandiflorum 'Red Beauty'	Slow growing cultivar with strong red flowers of good size. Ideal for small garden in shade.
£3.50	Epimedium x youngianum niveum	The most delicate of Epimedium species. Nodding white cups on hair thin stems.
£4.00	Erodium chrysanthum	Fine, silvery green foliage, forming neat mound. Long display sulphur yellow flowers.
£4.00	Erodium chrysanthum 'Pale pink form'	Delicate, ferny foliage of silvery-green, producing a long display of pale pink 'cups'

£3.50	Erythronium dens canis	Beautifully spotted leaves with mauve Dog's Tooth Violets hanging down. Woodland shade.
£3.00	Felicia rosulata	Hardy Himalayan species. Cornflower blue flowers with orange centres. Carpeter.
£3.00	Festuca gaultieri	Superb little alpine grass, forming dense emerald green dome. Good structural plant.
£3.00	Festuca 'Golden Toupee'	Slow growing and small in stature, fine needles of pure golden yellow. Would suit trough.
£8.00	Fritillaria camschatensis aurea	The yellow species type, flowering at 10" high in moist shade. Seldom offered.
£7.00	Fritillaria camschatensis Dwarf Form	Rarely offered, relic from Jack Drake alpine nsy. Japanese alpine, 6-8" high. Black flowers.
£4.00	Genista pilosa minor	First rate alpine shrublet, prostrate and smothered in lemon yellow pea flowers. Slow.
4.00	Genista sagittalis minor	Fairly slow to form a neat, low mound of flattened leaf stems, radiating yellow pea flowers
£3.50	Gentiana acaulis	Our seedlings are of a free flowering clone. Large blue trumpet Gentian of the Alps. Lime.
£4.00	Gentiana burseri	Erect species from the Pyrenees, approx. 2-3' tall. Whorls of greenish/yellow flrs. Lime/sun.
£4.00	Gentiana decumbens (Siberian Gentian)	High alt. species. Mid blue, bell flowers in Aug. on 10-12" stems. Easy in stony soil, full sun.
£3.00	Gentiana verna 'Angulosa'	The free flowering and easier to cultivate form of the beautiful Star Gentian of the Eur. Alps.
£3.00	Geranium dalmaticum 'Album'	Good, small compact form, would suit large trough or small rockery.
£3.00	Geranium dalmaticum 'Croftlea'	We were first to promote and propagate this free flowering, carpeting form. Slow, neat mound.
£4.00	Geranium farreri	An absolute gem! Compact and low growing, with huge palest blue flowers, over long period.
£3.00	Geranium macrorrhizum 'Snow Sprite'	Slow ground cover, sun/part shade. Long display pure white flwos. Suits smaller garden.
£3.00	Geranium renardii	Round, sage like leaves, and 6" stems of large cream flrs, deeply veined in grey. Himalayas.
£3.00	Geranium sanguineum 'Striatum'	Low mat, free flowering in shade, of soft light pink. Easy Geranium for almost any soil.
£3.00	Geum triflorum campanulatum	Ground hugging species, with ferny foliage. 4" stems, each with 3 nodding apricot bells. U.S.A
£4.00	Gypsophila aretioides	SPECIAL. For alpine house or sunny trough. Forms iron hard cushion, very slow growing.
£3.00	Gypsophila cerastoides	Close mat, hidden by the abundant white flowers. Makes a good trough plant.
£3.00	Gypsophila tenuifolius	Close grass-like cushion, with many pale pink flowers in spring. Neat dome for rockery.
£3.00	Happlopapus glutinosus	Narrow, evergreen leaves, forming small sub-shrub. Covered in deep orange daisies. Late.
£4.00	Haquetia epipactis	Yellow button flower, with large green sepals early Spring. Woodlander for moist shade. Alps
£3.00	Hebe buchanani minor	Beautiful, compact mound, only 6" high. A worthwhile alpine shrublet. White flowers. May.

£3.00	Hebe popplewellii	Small, globe of a shrub, dense growth forming a ball, some 4" x 6". Uncommon.
£3.00	Helianthemum 'Ben Ledi'	One of the best old cultivars for its low habit and many raspberry red flowers. Emerald green fol.
£3.00	Helianthemum 'Sunbeam'	Ideal for smaller rock garden, low mound producing tangerine blooms all summer long.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis Alba	Pure white form of this popular, early spring woodlander. Flowers above unmarked leaves.
£4.00	Hepatica Red Shades	These seedlings will vary, from reddish-pink to clear, deep red. Smaller and slower than blues.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis (Violet Blue)	This form we grow is from plants obtained with the darkest violet shade imaginable.
£4.00	Hepatica nobilis (Dusky Pink)	Selected for its soft lilac/pink shade, a welcome colour break, also free flowering.
£4.00	Hepatica transsilvanica	A species with a standard shade of soft cornflower blue. Good sized flrs, larger than nobilis
£4.00	Hepatica transsilvanica 'Blue Eyes'	A sterile meadia type, with sky blue petals and attractive violet eye. A vigorous clone.
£3.00	Heuchera grossularifolia	Small, deep green leaves hug compost, like a cushion. Short spikes of cream flowers. Late.
£3.00	Horminum pyrenaicum	The 'Dragon Head' of the Pyrenees. Puckered Primrose like leaves, nodding violet flowers.
£4.00	Hosta 'Blue Mouse Ears'	Ideal for shady troughs, etc. Rounded blue leaves with deep lilac, good sized flowers. Ht. 3"
£4.00	Hosta kikutii var yakusimensis <i>8cm pots</i>	A mere pad of tiny leaves, sending up 1" stems of large, lilac flowers. Quite uncommon.
£4.00	Hosta 'Stiletto'	Slender, light green leaves, attractively edged in cream. 10" spikes of violet flowers, August.
£3.00	Hosta venusta	Dark green leaves at ground level, stems rise to 10". Deep violet flowers in summer. From Japan
£3.00	Hylomecon japonicum	Japanese woodland poppy with large yellow flowers in April.
£3.00	Hypericum reptans	Prostrate mat of tiny, Thyme-like fol. and unnaturally large yellow flowers. Himalayas.
£3.00	Hypsela reniformis	Ideal carpeter for threading through gravel path edges, or rockery border. Chilean native.
£3.00	Iberis sempervirens 'Little Gem'	The toughest and best flowering of the dwarf, alpine candy tufts. Top class, long-lived plant.
£3.50	Ilex crenata 'Golden Gem'	Small rounded leaves of bright gold, on this low, slow growing shrub. Small enough for rockery.
£3.00	Impatiens omiense (species)	Truly hardy, ground covering species with attractive foliage and lots of late yellow flwrs.
£4.00	Incarvillea compacta	Raised from botanical seed, these will flower at approx. 9". Well drained soil, in full sun.
£4.00	Incarvillea mairei 'Grandiflora'	The true plant, with ground hugging foliage and 12" stems of gigantic rose pink flowers.
£3.00	Ipheion uniflorum 'Charlotte Bishop'	Tufts of grass-like stems produce long spring display of dusky pink stars. Very special.
£3.50	Iris pumila 'Cherry Garden'	For those who like dark flowers, this 8" Iris has large, aubergine coloured blooms in spring.
