



Achillea 'Brass Buttons'
Yarrow (Code: 5338)
 Fresh green, ferny foliage forms a low mat. Small cream-colored buds open to golden-yellow flowers in the spring. Although delicate-looking, it is tough and durable. (3" x 12") Zn4.



Achillea 'King Edward'
Yarrow (Code: 2014)
 Cream-hued flowers grace this lovely, tufting, evergreen rock garden plant. A wonderful choice for the dry garden site. Requires good drainage. (4-6" x 10") Zn5.



Achillea 'Moonshine'
Yarrow (Code: 2010)
 Clusters of sulfur-yellow flowers top soft gray foliage most of the summer. This wonderful evergreen selection is a long time favorite with designers. (24" x 16") Zn4.



Achillea 'Walter Funcke'
Yarrow (Code: 7483)
 Brick-red flowers gradually fade to numerous lighter shades of orange-red. Silvery, drought tolerant foliage is the perfect foil for the long blooming flowers. (24" x 24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Appleblossom'
Yarrow (Code: 5113)
 Bright lilac-pink flowers fade to pastel pink on this long-blooming and easy to grow garden favorite. It makes an excellent cut flower. (2' x 2') Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Fireland'
Yarrow (Code: 6423)
 Drought tolerant perennial featuring orange-red flowers with prominent golden centers. The flowers fade to salmon pink, then tawny gold, creating a fiery effect. (20" x 24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Lilac Beauty'
Yarrow (Code: 4565)
 Lovely lilac pink flowers appear all summer. The flowers become lighter as they age, creating a multicolored effect that is very pleasing to the eye. It's perfect for the middle of the border. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Oertel's Rose'
Yarrow (Code: 6795)
 Bright orchid-pink blossoms slowly fade to nearly white. Hardy, drought tolerant and easy to grow. Showy all summer! (28" x 24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Paprika'
Yarrow (Code: 2021)
 Clusters of bright scarlet flowers with yellow centers fade beautifully to salmon-rose. Drought tolerant, easy to grow and good for bouquets. Long-blooming when deadheaded. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Salmon Beauty'
Yarrow (Code: 2024)
 Large, flat clusters of tiny blooms open in hues of deep salmon which brighten to soft pink. This drought tolerant and easy to grow selection also makes a great cut flower! (24-30" x 18-30") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Sawa Sawa'
Yarrow (Code: 7444)
 Rich, deep red flowers dazzle above thick mounds of fern-like foliage. Good for cut flowers, very drought tolerant. (20" x 18") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Summerwine'
Yarrow (Code: 4871)
 Stunning wine-red flowers glow over feathery green foliage in early summer. It's perfect for sunny locations. (24-28" x 24") Zn3.



Achillea millefolium 'Terra Cotta'
Yarrow (Code: 6146)
 Masses of dark salmon flowers mature to russet hues; the color of red clay! The fine feathery foliage is evergreen, easy to grow, and drought tolerant. (24-30" x 24-30") Zn3.



Achillea ptarmica 'Angel's Breath'
Yarrow (Code: 2025)
 Masses of 1/2" wide, pure white, double flowers appear in early summer and fade to ivory. The deep green, "ferny" foliage is extremely drought tolerant. (16" x 24") Zn4.





Acheillea tomentosa 'Lemon' (aka 'Lemon Yellow Form')
Yarrow (Code: 2020)
 Lovely lemon yellow flowers are set off by ferny, evergreen foliage. Excellent in rock gardens or as a groundcover. (3-4" x 16") Zn4.



Aegopodium podagraria 'Variegatum'
Bishop's Weed (Code: 2040)
 This vigorous, carefree groundcover has attractive cream and green-variegated leaves. It looks best when grown in partial shade in moist soil, but it will tolerate almost any growing condition. (6-10" x 12") Zn3.



Agapanthus 'Cobalt Blue'
African Lily (Code: 7464)
 Cobalt-blue globe-like umbels appear on 2' stalks above strap-like leaves in summer. An excellent choice for adding an exotic touch to containers or the garden. (24" x 12-24") Zn8.



Agapanthus africanus 'Peter Pan'
Lily of the Nile (Code: 3110)
 Violet-blue flowers in stunning large round umbels display high above narrow, bright green, strappy leaves in summer. It prefers a hot spot with good drainage. (3' x 2') Zn8.



Agastache 'Blue Fortune'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 6204)
 Long lasting, deep lilac-blue flower spikes top fragrant foliage. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! One of the hardiest and dependable Agastache. (30" x 24") Zn6.



Agastache 'Cotton Candy'
Hyssop (Code: 6625)
 Light pink flower spikes bloom from midsummer to fall! Compact habit, drought tolerant and very attractive to hummingbirds. Requires good drainage. (18-24" x 18") Zn6. PP20991, PVR Propagation Prohibited.



Agastache 'Raspberry Summer'
Hyssop (Code: 6626)
 Large, dark raspberry-pink flowers bloom all summer and into fall! Attractive, bright green foliage is nicely fragrant and drought tolerant. Requires good drainage. (30" x 20") Zn6. PP20371, PVR Propagation Prohibited.



Agastache 'Summer Glow'
Hyssop (Code: 6627)
 Pale yellow flowers with dark calyces bloom all summer. Has a narrow upright habit with bright green foliage that is drought tolerant. Requires good drainage. (18-24" x 18") Zn6. PP20980, PVR Propagation Prohibited.



Agastache 'Summer Sky'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 4586)
 Glowing violet-blue flowers with dark calyces bloom all summer above bright green foliage. With a compact habit, it always stays tidy and upright. Good drainage is needed for best performance. (14-16" x 16-20") Zn8. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Agastache aurantiaca 'Apricot Sunrise'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 2009)
 Delicate spikes of orange sherbert-colored flowers top shrubby gray-green foliage. Excellent for attracting butterflies and hummingbirds, and perfect for the middle of the mixed border! (24-30" x 12-18") Zn6.



Agastache aurantiaca 'Navajo Sunset'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 3257)
 Citrus-scented foliage and bright orange-red tubular flowers bloom in summer. A hummingbird magnet. (12-18" x 12-18") Zn6.



Agastache barberi 'Firebird'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 4730)
 Rosy sunset-coral flowers dazzle summer to frost, above aromatic foliage. Hummingbirds adore this stunning plant. Excellent for cutting and requires good drainage. (30" x 18") Zn6.



Agastache barberi 'Tutti Frutti'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 6777)
 One of the showiest varieties of agastache. Masses of deep pink flowers on tall stalks make a vivid backdrop. Has a wonderful fruity aroma! (36-48" x 18") Zn6.



Agastache foeniculum 'Golden Jubilee'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 2678)
 New foliage emerges gold, then turns bright lime-green. Lavender-blue flowers make this a standout in the garden. Leaves release a mint scent when lightly crushed. (20" x 15") Zn5.





Agastache mexicana 'Sangria'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 4051)
 From July to October clusters of arching, red-purple blooms appear whorled around stems, one stacked on top of another. It grows up to 4' tall with lemon-scented foliage. A favorite of hummingbirds. (4' x 2-3') Zn7.



Agastache mexicana Acapulco 'Orange'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 3848)
 Vibrant orange, tubular flowers add incredible color all summer to mixed containers and landscape plantings. A favorite of hummingbirds. (24-30" x 18") Zn7. PP16308 Propagation Prohibited.



Agastache mexicana Acapulco 'Salmon & Pink'
Anise Hyssop (Code: 3849)
 Stunning multi-colored pink and salmon-hued flowers bloom all summer and are wonderful for landscape use and in mixed containers. A favorite of hummingbirds. (24-30" x 18") Zn7. PP16023 Propagation Prohibited.



Agastache rupestris
Anise Hyssop (Code: 7361)
 Beautiful salmon orange flowers with lavender purple calyxes last from late summer until frost! Fine gray-green, licorice-scented foliage adds interest. It thrives in a hot spot with good drainage. (18-24" x 18") Zn5.



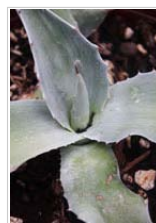
Agave 'Silver Surfer'
Century Plant (Code: 7277)
 Dramatic, rigid, silvery-blue succulent leaves grow into a 5' tall specimen plant! This architectural plant makes an exotic focal point in the garden or use in containers. (5' x 6-9") Zn8.



Agave gentryi 'Jaws'
Hardy Century Plant (Code: 7279)
 The name reflects the fantastic shape of the glossy evergreen leaves which are concave and heavily toothed. It forms a large clump that commands attention. (24" x 36-48") Zn7.



Agave montana 'Baccarat'
Mountain Agave (Code: 7282)
 This Agave features broad, blue-green evergreen leaves with beautiful silver markings on the back of the leaf, reminiscent of crystal etching. Perfect for desert rock gardens. (24-36" x 24-36") Zn7.



Agave ovatifolia 'Frosty Blue'
Agave (Code: 7627)
 One of the largest cold hardy Agaves, it can eventually grow up to 6 feet tall by 6 feet wide. The rounded rosette of short wide gray leaves are distinctively cupped with small teeth along their margins and a 1- inch long dark gray terminal spine. (6-8' x 4-6') Zn7.



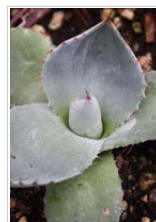
Agave parryi
Parry's Agave (Code: 6301)
 Striking blue-green, sword-like succulent evergreen leaves have long spines. This classic desert garden plant is perfect as a dramatic focal point in the garden or as a container plant. (30-36" x 36-40") Zn7.



Agave parryi 'J.C. Raulston'
Parry's Agave (Code: 7285)
 This Agave forms symmetrical rosettes of blue-gray wedge-shaped evergreen leaves. Slow to form offsets, it is a good choice where space is small, or for use in containers. (24" x 24-36") Zn7.



Agave parryi ssp. huachucensis
Huachuca Agave (Code: 7284)
 This Agave forms very attractive rosettes of glaucous blue-gray, wedge-shaped evergreen leaves. Perfect for xeriscaping or for containers. (24" x 24") Zn7.



Agave parryi ssp. truncata
Silver Agave (Code: 7286)
 Blue-gray succulent leaves form a marvelous symmetrical rosette. Each rounded evergreen leaf terminates with a dark pointed spike. A classic and favorite among Agave collectors. (18" x 18") Zn7.



Agave schidigera 'Black Widow'
Agave (Code: 7288)
 Rigid, dark green succulent leaves have silver marking and edges with curly fibers. The compact symmetrical growth habit makes it useful in the rock garden or in containers. (12" x 18") Zn8.



Agave striata
Hedgehog Agave (Code: 6305)
 Symmetrical, spherical rosettes consist of hard curved, narrow leaves with a pronounced terminal spike. Makes an excellent container plant. (24-36" x 36-40") Zn10.





Agonis flexuosa 'Jervis Bay After Dark'
Peppermint Tree (Willow Myrtle) (Code: 4890)
 Brilliant scarlet colored, willow-like leaves appear in spring and darken to deep burgundy. Small fragrant white flowers with burgundy centers appear in clusters from spring into early summer. (18' x 10-12") Zn9. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Allium cernuum
Nodding Onion (Code: 2047)
 Lavender-pink, nodding flower heads are an excellent addition to the rock garden. It may naturalize under optimum conditions. (18" x 9") Zn3.



Allium senescens 'Glaucum'
Ornamental Onion (Code: 5084)
 Soft lavender-pink, ball-shaped flowers top interesting curly blue foliage. Lovely and long-blooming, it is great for rock gardens. (6" x 12") Zn3.



Antennaria dioica 'Rubra'
Pussy Toes (Code: 6663)
 Deep red flowerheads appear on 4-8" stems above tufts of tiny, tight gray leaves. Forms a low, creeping mat that is perfect between paving stones or for the sunny rock garden. This is a tough plant that will take hot spots and poor, dry soil. (4-6" x 12") Zn4.



Arabis caucasica 'Pixie Cream'
Rock Cress (Code: 4067)
 Creamy-yellow flowers with bright yellow eyes cover velvety gray-green foliage in spring. This rock garden plant prefers well-drained soil, and moderate temperatures. (3-4" x 12") Zn3.



Arabis caucasica 'Snowcap'
Rock Cress (Code: 2140)
 This low-growing perennial is great for rock gardens or cascading over walls. Beautiful pure white flowers sparkle in spring. (4" x 12") Zn3.



Arabis caucasica 'Variegata'
Rock Cress (Code: 5356)
 Striking emerald and cream, felted evergreen leaves are topped with pure white flowers in spring. The late season foliage is very attractive. A collector's plant. (8" x 24") Zn3.



Arabis ferdinandi-coburgi 'Old Gold'
Rock Cress (Code: 5720)
 This vigorous low spreader has great evergreen leaves with wide chartreuse margins. White flowers appear in May. (4" x 18") Zn4.



Arabis x arendsii 'La Fraicheur'
Rock Cress (Code: 4069)
 Rose-pink flowers cover gray-green foliage in April. This rock garden plant prefers well-drained soil and moderate temperatures. (3-4" x 12") Zn3.



Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Massachusetts'
Kinnikinnick, Bearberry (Code: 5674)
 This popular native evergreen groundcover is very cold and drought tolerant. Small pink flowers bloom in early spring and are followed by bright red berries in fall. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.



Arctostaphylos uva-ursi 'Vancouver Jade'
Kinnikinnick (Code: 6383)
 Small pink flowers in spring turn into scarlet-red fruit in summer and fall. This drought tolerant, glossy-leaved, evergreen groundcover is deservedly popular. (4" x 36-72") Zn3.



Artemisia 'Huntington'
Wormwood (Code: 2157)
 Silvery gray, finely-cut foliage adorns this bushy plant. Excellent for either containers or flower beds and borders. An excellent perennial for areas with poor, dry soil. (30-42" x 30") Zn3.



Artemisia 'Powis Castle'
Wormwood (Code: 2159)
 Soft, sturdy, gray leaves form a mound of finely-divided foliage. A wonderful textural accent for the garden. It can also be used as small evergreen hedge. (24-36" x 24-36") Zn6.



Artemisia lactiflora 'Guizhou'
White Mugwort (Code: 5907)
 Dark green, nearly-black, foliage has a red-tinted reverse. Sprays of pearly-white flowers appear in early summer. (48" x 24-36") Zn3.





Artemisia ludoviciana 'Valerie Finnis'
Wormwood (Code: 2166)
 Broad, jagged silvery-white foliage provides a foil for bright or dark colored companion plants in the border. Native to the Pacific Northwest. (30" x 30") Zn5.



Artemisia pycnocephala 'David's Choice'
Wormwood (Code: 2167)
 Delicate silver foliage forms attractive soft mounds. This beautiful dwarf evergreen selection makes an excellent addition to the rock garden. (12" x 24-36") Zn7.



Artemisia schmidtiana 'Silver Mound'
Wormwood (Code: 2162)
 Attractive fern-like, silvery foliage has a clumping habit that is perfect as a rock garden plant or for edging. A great companion for geraniums or roses. (12-16" x 24") Zn3.



Asclepias tuberosa 'Gay Butterflies'
Butterfly Weed (Code: 2176)
 The bright yellow, orange and red flowers are a magnet for butterflies. This meadow wildflower requires somewhat dry, well-drained soil and a sunny location. (24" x 18-24") Zn4.



Aster oblongifolius (Symphyotrichum oblongifolium) 'Dream of Beauty'
Aster (Code: 4232)
 A superb high plains native known for its vigorous, low-spreading habit and amazing fall display of fragrant light pink flowers with burnt orange centers. It spreads to form a dense carpet of flowers and grows in almost any type of soil. (12" x 24-30") Zn4.



Azorella trifurcata 'Nana' (Bolax glebaria 'Nana')
Cushion Plant (Code: 5456)
 Small, tough, rigid leaves grow tightly together, forming a textured mound. An unusual and wonderful, evergreen spreader, great for spilling around rocks or edging paths. (12" x 6") Zn3.



Ballota acetabulosa 'All Hallow's Green'
Horehound (Code: 2257)
 This excellent drought resistant sub shrub is a great foliage accent! Quilted chartreuse leaves add wonderful texture to the garden. Tiny pale green flowers are not showy, appearing from mid to late summer. (16" x 24") Zn8.



Baptisia 'Carolina Moonlight'
Wild Indigo (Code: 3946)
 Striking blue-green foliage glows beneath stunning 18" spires of soft creamy-yellow in early summer. Long-blooming, it makes an elegant statement in the perennial border. (3-4' x 3-4') Zn4.



Baptisia 'Purple Smoke'
False Indigo (Code: 6388)
 Smokey-violet flowers with purple eyes bloom in late spring on charcoal-hued stems. It grows to 4' tall, with gray-green foliage. A mature plant can bear over 50 blooming stalks! (4' x 3-4') Zn4.



Baptisia 'Twilite Prairieblues'TM
Wild Indigo (Code: 3947)
 Handsome blue-green foliage is topped by tightly-packed 32" tall spires of deep violet and lemon-yellow blooms. Robust and vigorous. (3-4' x 4-5') Zn4. PP19011 Propagation Prohibited.



Baptisia australis
False Indigo (Code: 2252)
 Panicles of indigo-blue, sweet pea flowers top attractive blue-gray foliage. An outstanding long-lived perennial, it was the PPA Plant of the Year for 2010. (3' x 4') Zn4.



Bergeranthus jamesii
Ice Plant (Code: 4359)
 This ice plant relative blooms in summer with yellow, daisy-like flowers among tight clusters of succulent, triangular leaves. It's best suited to rock gardens or on a slope with sharp drainage. (2" x 6") Zn7.



Boltonia asteroides 'Snowbank'
False Starwort (Code: 2272)
 Tall, wiry stems are clothed in thousands of tiny white daisies. This sturdy, trouble-free plant reaches 4-5' in height, yet needs no staking! Wonderful for cut bouquets and adds a mass of color to the late-season garden. (4-5" x 30") Zn4.



Boltonia asteroides var. latsiquama 'Jim Crockett'
Bolton's Aster (Code: 3241)
 Medium to dark green foliage produces starry lavender flowers with yellow centers. Compact and very floriferous. (18-24" x 18-24") Zn4. PP16678 Propagation Prohibited.





Bouteloua gracilis 'Blonde Ambition'
Blue Gramma, Mosquito Grass (Code: 7804)
 The brush-like flowers rise up out of the blue-green foliage in mid-summer and are suspended horizontally for months on stiff, weather-resistant stems. The flowers turn chartreuse by fall and then mature to long-lasting blonde seed heads. Larger-growing than the native Blue Gramma. (24-36" x 24-36") Zn4. PPAF



Calamagrostis arundinacea brachytricha
Feather Reed Grass (Code: 2278)
 Upright fluffy flower spikes emerge briefly in early summer in Oregon, then bloom again in fall. A graceful and arching grass that grows well in moist locations. (3-4' x 3') Zn5.



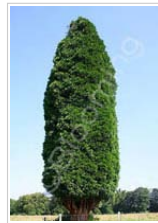
Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Avalanche'
Feather Reed Grass (Code: 5999)
 Medium-sized clumps showcase dramatically-stripped foliage. Airy, rose-tinged plumes take on warm golden hues later in the season. (3-5' x 3-5') Zn5.



Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Karl Foerster'
Feather Reed Grass (Code: 5160)
 Upright soft green leaves are topped by tall, vertical, rose-colored plumes that mature to a golden-wheat color. This 2001 Perennial Plant Association Plant of the Year is also a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (5' x 2') Zn4.



Calamagrostis x acutiflora 'Overdam'
Feather Reed Grass (Code: 6007)
 Arching, green and white-stripped leaves are topped by upright bronze flower spikes that gradually fade to buff. The foliage takes on a green-to-red tinge in the fall. (3' x 2') Zn5.



Calocedrus decurrens
Incense Cedar (Code: 7272)
 This 'NW native conifer has a narrow conical shape with reddish brown bark. The scale-like, fragrant, evergreen leaves form flat sprays and carry cinnamon colored seed cones. It is excellent when used for tall hedges. (50' x 10') Zn5.



Calocephalus (Leucophyta) brownii
Cushion Bush (Code: 5429)
 This heavily-branched, chalk white, woolly shrub is dramatic and unusual. Topped by yellow button flowers in summer, it is a wonderful twiggly accent for containers and an excellent choice for the rockery. (18-24" x 24") Zn8.



Campanula portenschlagiana
Bellflower (Code: 5476)
 This vigorous evergreen creeper bears large clusters of open, violet-blue, bell-shaped flowers that bloom for months. Drought tolerant, it's a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. It will re-seed and naturalize to form a small colony. (4" x 24") Zn4.



Campanula poscharskyana
Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2306)
 A lovely, vigorous perennial with blue starry flowers that bloom for months. Drought tolerant and very adaptable, it's a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest. (6-9" x 14") Zn4.



Campanula poscharskyana 'Blue Gown'
Adriatic Bellflower (Code: 2254)
 Star-like true-blue flowers are larger than the species and cover this low-growing variety for many months. Excellent in rock gardens or spilling over walls and container edges. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn3.



Campanula punctata 'Hot Lips'
Bellflower (Code: 4829)
 Long blooming 2" tubular, white bellflowers are heavily speckled with burgundy-pink "lips". Excellent in the rock garden or use as a groundcover. (10" x 10") Zn4. PPAF Propagation Prohibited



Carex dolichostachya 'Kaga nishiki'
Gold Fountain Sedge (Code: 4805)
 Fine green leaves have a gold stripe along each edge. Low and fountain-like, this sedge works well in drifts, as a formal border or specimen. Tolerant of many conditions and exposures. (12" x 24") Zn5.



Carex flacca
Blue Sedge (Code: 3734)
 Evergreen chalky-blue blades spread to form a groundcover that will tolerate shade. Blue flowers on blue stems appear in early summer. (15" x 15") Zn4.



Carex flagellifera
Weeping Brown Sedge (Code: 2281)
 This graceful and finely-textured grass has arching mounds of orange-bronze foliage. It makes a nice contrast with silver foliage and brightly colored flowers. (18" x 24") Zn7.





Carex morrowii 'Ice Dance'
Variegated Sedge (Code: 6653)
 Dark green leaves with white edges form arching mounds of evergreen foliage. It will spread to form a groundcover that's easy to control. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (12" x 18") Zn5.



Carex muskingumensis 'Ice Fountains'
Palm Leaf Sedge (Code: 6190)
 Slender blades have distinct white interiors. The white variegation gradually turns to pale green by midsummer. It spreads slowly to form a small colony in moist soils. (28" x 18") Zn3.



Carex muskingumensis 'Oehme'
Palm Leaf Sedge (Code: 4166)
 Abundant narrow green leaves in spring resemble a miniature palm tree. The narrow leaves have vivid yellow margins by summer. (24" x 24") Zn4.



Carex nigra 'Variegata'
Variegated Sedge (Code: 6297)
 Light green blades to 12" are softly edged in yellow. This vigorous groundcover is good for partial shade. It will also tolerate drier soils. (12" x 18") Zn5.



Carex subfusca
Rusty Sedge (Code: 7419)
 This native western US sedge is found everywhere from the sea to the desert. Low growing with narrow, upright, dark green leaves, it spreads to form a low maintenance lawn or groundcover. Easy to grow in almost any situation. (4-10" x 18-36") Zn5.



Carex testacea
Copper Hair Sedge (Code: 5540)
 Unusual, finely-textured bronzy blades turn nearly orange in sun and almost olive-green in shade. It forms a rounded mound of arching foliage that is excellent for rock gardens, massing, or container plantings. (16" x 12") Zn6.



Carex tumulicola
Berkeley Sedge (Code: 6823)
 Very narrow bright green blades form evergreen clumps. Use as a groundcover under trees or in moist areas. It reseeds readily. Native to the Pacific Northwest. (12" x 18") Zn7.



Caryopteris incana 'Sunshine Blue'™
Bluebeard (Code: 3262)
 Bright golden foliage is accented by stunning deep blue flowers, late summer through fall. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3' x 3') Zn6. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Caryopteris x clandonensis 'Blue Mist'
Bluebeard (Code: 2347)

Bluebeard (Code: 2349)

Caryopteris x clandonensis 'First Choice'
Bluebeard (Code: 4072)

Catananche caerulea
Cupid's Dart (Code: 2350)
 Lavender to lilac-blue daisy-like flowers bloom for many weeks in summer above strap-like, hairy leaves. The flowers are displayed on long stems, perfect for either cut or dried flowers. (18" x 12") Zn5.



Ceanothus 'Centennial'
California Lilac (Code: 6670)
 This low-growing, spreading, evergreen shrub has dark blue flowers in spring. A native cultivar of the Pacific coast, it is tolerant of summer heat and drought. (8-12" x 72") Zn7.





Ceanothus 'Dark Star'

California Lilac (Code: 6748)

Orchid Rockrose (Code: 6885)

Morning Glory (Code: 2425)

Torbay Palm (Code: 7725)

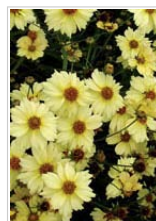

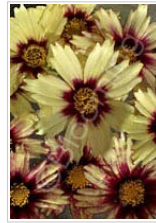
Mouse Ear Coreopsis (Code: 3659)

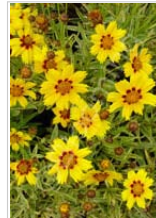

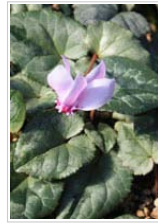

Ice Plant (Code: 3903)

Cooper's Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 2459)

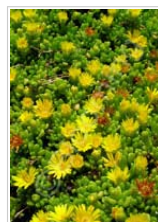

Delosperma nubigenum 'Basutoland'
Hardy Ice Plant (Code: 3904)
 From the higher elevations in Africa, this hardy Delosperma has thick fleshy leaves and brilliant yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. Very drought tolerant, it forms a low growing evergreen mat of foliage. (1-3" x 6") Zn5.



Dichondra argentea 'Silver Falls'
Kidneyweed (Code: 4959)

Dorycnium hirsutum
Hairy Canary Clover (Code: 5178)

Echinacea 'Hot Lava'

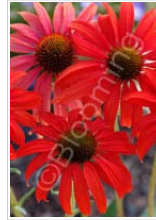

Echinacea Big Sky™ 'Harvest Moon' (Matthew Saul)
Coneflower (Code: 3233)

The flowers have lovely golden mango-colored petals that radiate around warm orange centers and bloom from mid to late summer. This is another vigorous coneflower from the Big Sky™ series. (24-30" x 2') Zn4. PP17652 Propagation Prohibited.


Echinacea Big Sky™ 'Sundown' ('Evan Saul')
Coneflower (Code: 3232)

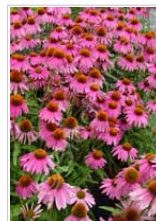

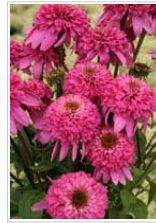

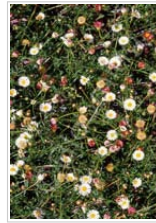


Erigeron glaucus

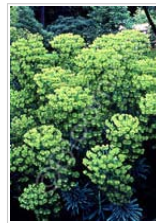

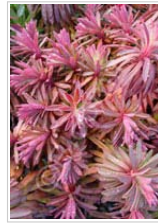

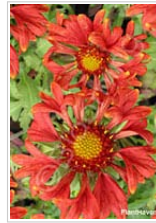

Blanket Flower (Code: 2686)

Gaillardia x grandiflora 'Oranges and Lemons'
Blanket Flower (Code: 3758)
 Fantastic large yellow flowers with orange centers on green foliage appear in summer. A heavy bloomer, it will repeat bloom if spent flowers are deadheaded. (18-30" x 12-18") Zn6. PP17092 Propagation Prohibited.



Gaultheria shallon
Salal (Code: 6347)

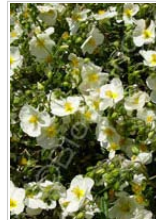

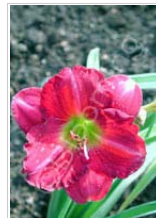

Hemerocallis 'Pink Dolle'
Daylily (Code: 2828)
 Large medium pink flowers with lemon-yellow throats. The blooms appear in July. (24" x 24") Zn3.



Hemerocallis 'Plum Beauty'
Daylily (Code: 6089)
 Very large yellow-eyed, deep plum flowers are produced in profusion over a long period. The blooms can reach up to 5" across. (28" x 24") Zn3.



Hemerocallis 'Siloam Royal Prince'
Daylily (Code: 6839)
 Ruffled, deep reddish-purple flowers with green throats are an eye-catching addition to the garden. An excellent choice for mid-season color in the garden. (19" x 20") Zn3.



Hemerocallis 'Siloam Tiny Tim'
Daylily (Code: 6803)
 Attractive rosy-lavender flowers have a broad, deeper purple eye and green throat. A nice, compact, profusely-blooming addition to any garden. (12-14" x 12-18") Zn3.



Hemerocallis 'Space Wars'
Daylily (Code: 4602)
 6 1/2" fragrant flowers are a lovely peachy-pink edged with red, and accented by a bold red eyezone and chartreuse throat. A great low-maintenance plant for the mixed border. (28" x 24") Zn3.



Hemerocallis 'Texas Sunlight'
Daylily (Code: 6855)
 This reblooming award winner has ruffled, solid gold 3" flowers that glow in the landscape. It's easy to grow and has great branching and bud count. (28" x 24") Zn3.



Hemerocallis lilioasphodelus (syn. flava)
Lemon Lily (Code: 2840)

Rupturewort (Code: 2843)

Hosta 'Big Daddy'
Plantain Lily (Code: 6288)
 Impressive deep blue, round and puckered leaves on a large, vigorous grower. Topped by off white flowers on 36" scapes in late spring. (2-3' x 3-4') Zn3.



Hosta 'Sea Thunder'
Plantain Lily (Code: 4350)
 Upright, pointedly-oval leaves have eye-catching white centers and wide irregular green margins. A gorgeous addition to the shade garden. (24" x 24") Zn3.



Iberis 'Snow Cushion'
Candytuft (Code: 7695)
 This dwarf form of candytuft has showy, white blossoms in spring. It has a low spreading form with glossy, fine textured evergreen foliage that is deep green in color. Highly recommended for rock gardens! (4-6" x 12-18") Zn3.



Imperata cylindrica 'Red Baron'
Blood Grass (Code: 2913)
 The brilliant red leaf blades are even more iridescent when back-lit by the autumn sun; especially when planted en masse. This short grass prefers moist areas. (WA and OR only) (18" x 12") Zn6.



Juncus 'Occidental Blue'
Bog Rush (Code: 5541)
 Clumps of stiffly-upright, blue-gray needles radiate from its base. Creates a marvelous textural accent, adding cool hues and bold form to any garden. It prefers moist to wet locations. (12" x 12") Zn5.



Juncus inflexus 'Blue Arrows'
Common Rush (Code: 4984)
 The gray-blue foliage grows in stiff, upright clumps. This moisture loving rush is heat and drought tolerant too! Perfect for containers or as accent in the garden. (24-36" x 18-24") Zn5.



Juncus patens
Common Rush (Code: 7832)
 Green, graceful knee-high arching foliage with brown flowers then seed heads from May to Nov. Loves wet feet but can tolerate dry to drought conditions once established. Native from WA to CA. (2-3' x 2-3') Zn6.



Kniphofia 'Coral Glow'
Poker Lily (Code: 6321)
 Large, glowing coral and red bicolor pokers top broad, evergreen sword-like foliage in summer. It lends an exotic air to the garden year-round. Great as a cut flower too. Dramatic! (3' x 2') Zn6.



Kniphofia 'Corallina'
Poker Lily (Code: 6322)

Poker Lily (Code: 4558)

Red Hot Poker, Torchlily (Code: 3876)

Lantana 'Spreading Sunset'

Lantana (Code: 5223)

Striking clusters of pink, orange and yellow flowers resemble a summer sunset. Excellent for use in flower beds or trailing from hanging baskets and containers. Extremely heat tolerant. (12" x 24") Zn9.



Lantana camara 'Anne Marie'

Lantana (Code: 4628)

This compact form has a dense bushy habit and a profusion of multi-colored flowers all season. The flowers start yellow, then change to orange-pink, then change to fuchsia-red. All different colors usually appear at the same time. A favorite of butterflies and hummingbirds. (12-15" x 24") Zn9. PP11310 Propagation Prohibited.



Lantana camara 'Dallas Red'

Lantana (Code: 5226)

Clusters of sultry, deep red blooms are accented with orange and yellow. Excellent for use in flower beds or trailing from hanging baskets and containers. Fragrant and heat tolerant. (18-24" x 24-36") Zn9.



Lantana camara 'Florida Orange Mound'

Lantana (Code: 4629)

Flowers are entirely orange and bloom all season on a low mounding sub-shrub. A magnet for butterflies and hummingbirds. (12-15" x 18-24") Zn9.



Lantana camara 'Florida Red Mound'

Lantana (Code: 4630)

Flowers are entirely orange-red and bloom profusely all season. It forms a low mounding sub-shrub that is a favorite of butterflies and hummingbirds. (12-15" x 24") Zn9. PP17106 Propagation Prohibited.



Lantana camara 'Pink Caprice'

Lantana (Code: 5238)

Pink and yellow bicolor flower clusters adorn fresh, green foliage. It has a soft, upright habit and blooms for a very long time. (18-24" x 24-36") Zn9.



Lavandula angustifolia 'Betty Blue'

English Lavender (Code: 4683)

This English Lavender cultivar is excellent for fresh cut flowers or for drying. The deep blue-violet flowers have a dark purple calyx with a violet corolla. The flowers are somewhat taller than the species. (2-3' x 2') Zn5.



Lavandula angustifolia 'Bowles'

English Lavender (Code: 8072)

Spikes of lavender flowers and aromatic gray-green foliage makes this herb a standout in the garden. Maintains a tidy rounded habit. (18" x 16") Zn5.



Lavandula angustifolia 'Buena Vista'

English Lavender (Code: 3102)

English Lavender (Code: 8073)
 This compact growing herb features light purple flowers and an earlier bloom time than most Lavender. The fragrant flowers dry well. (14" x 12-18") Zn5.



Lavandula angustifolia 'Premier'
English Lavender (Code: 3100)
 Fragrant gray-green, evergreen foliage is topped by aromatic purple flower spikes. Dries well, and even reblooms in fall. (2' x 2') Zn5.



Lavandula angustifolia 'Purple Bouquet'
English Lavender (Code: 3234)
 This Lavender has long stems and very dark purple blooms in summer. An attractive addition to any garden, it also rewards with bouquets of sweetly fragrant blossoms. (18-24" x 24-30") Zn5.



Lavandula angustifolia 'Sachet'
English Lavender (Code: 3098)

Grey French Lavender (Code: 8067)

Lavandula stoechas 'Boysenberry Ruffles'
Spanish Lavender (Code: 4014)
 Stunning bicolor flowers have light pink "rabbit ears" shining above dark purple flowers. This long-blooming cultivar has light green foliage and stays compact. (12-18" x 15") Zn7. PP18256 Propagation Prohibited.



Lavandula stoechas 'Helmsdale'
Spanish Lavender (Code: 9021)
 A robust, long-blooming cultivar with rich, red-purple flowers that have burgundy "rabbit ears," atop bright green, upright foliage. It will bloom mid-spring to early fall. (30" x 30") Zn7.



Lavandula stoechas 'Madrid Blue'
Spanish Lavender (Code: 6732)

Lavandula stoechas 'Otto Quast'
Spanish Lavender (Code: 4616)
 Small purple flowers are crowned by purple, petal-like bracts. It flowers freely spring through summer above gray-green leaves. A popular cultivar. (18-24" x 24-36") Zn7.



Lavandula stoechas 'Red Star'
Spanish Lavender (Code: 4283)
 Dark pink "rabbit-eared" flowers with pale pink bracts appear from spring through summer above silver-gray, needle-like foliage. It has a better growth habit than Lavender 'Kew Red'. (14-16" x 16") Zn7.



Lavandula stoechas 'Silver Anouk'
Spanish Lavender (Code: 7471)

Lavandula stoechas 'Wings of Night'

Lavandula x 'Goodwin Creek Grey'
Lavender (Code: 5369)

Lavandula x intermedia 'Alba'
Lavandin (Code: 8071)
 Tall spikes of pure white, fragrant flowers top lovely silver foliage. This gorgeous evergreen selection often reblooms. It prefers a sunny location with well-drained soil. (2' x 2') Zn5.



Lavandula x intermedia 'Dilly Dilly'
Lavandin (Code: 4732)
 Beautiful long flower spikes of palest purple rise above compact silvery-gray foliage. Flowers are excellent for cutting or potpourri when dried. A simply heavenly scent! (12-24" x 12-24") Zn5.



Lavandula x intermedia 'Fred Boutin'
Lavandin (Code: 5368)
 This robust plant produces masses of violet blooms on 8" stems that hold their color nicely when dried. The large silvery leaves are quite striking. (30" x 30") Zn5.



Lavandula x intermedia 'Goldburg'
Lavandin (Code: 4546)
 The creamy-yellow and green-variegated foliage is topped by lavender-blue flower spikes in summer. It has a compact, mounding habit. Unusual! (18" x 18") Zn5. PP12709 Propagation Prohibited.



Lavandula x intermedia 'Gros Bleu'
Lavandin (Code: 3861)
 One of the darkest purple-flowering Lavenders. Borne on exceptionally-long stems, this is the first choice for fresh or dried flowers. It also makes a handsome shrub or hedge in the landscape. (30" x 24-30") Zn5.





Lavandula x intermedia 'Grosso'

Lavandin (Code: 8074)

Violet-blue flowers bloom repeatedly on this vigorous, disease resistant cultivar. It makes excellent dried flowers and is one of the best Lavenders for producing essential oil. (24-36" x 24") Zn5.



Lavandula x intermedia 'Hidcote Giant'

Lavandin (Code: 3813)

A fragrant, medium-sized shrub with large, branched stems smothered by big purple flowers. (30-36" x 24") Zn5.



Lavandula x intermedia 'Impress Purple'

Lavandin (Code: 4384)

Tree Mallow (Code: 5360)

Tree Mallow (Code: 5668)

Tree Mallow (Code: 4531)

Profuse clusters of deep red-pink flowers adorn this lovely, bushy Lavatera. It grows into a large, beautiful herbaceous shrub, perfect for the back of the border. (4' x 4') Zn7. PP13898 Propagation Prohibited.



Lavatera oblia 'Aurea'

Tree Mallow (Code: 6769)

Pink, cup-shaped flowers shimmer against golden-chartreuse foliage. A bit less vigorous than other Lavatera and a stunning addition to the mixed border. (4-5' x 3') Zn7.



Lavatera thuringiaca 'Barnsley'

Tree Mallow (Code: 3008)

This large herbaceous shrub has blooms resembling hollyhocks. The flowers open white, then turn pale pink with a deeper pink flush. This is the most popular Lavatera. (5-6' x 3-4') Zn6.



Lavatera thuringiaca 'Rosea'

Tree Mallow (Code: 5451)

Rosy-pink flowers resembling single hollyhocks adorn this very popular shrubby perennial. Gray-green foliage adds interest. (5' x 3') Zn6.



Lavatera x clementii 'Chamallow'

Tree Mallow (Code: 4484)

Single, non-fading, bright pink saucer-shaped flowers bloom over a long period in summer. This bushy, upright form has velvety, gray-green leaves. (36-48" x 30-36") Zn6. PP15478 Propagation Prohibited.





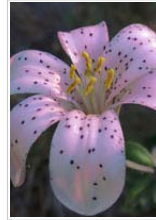
Lewisia cotyledon 'Regenbogen'
Bitter Root (Code: 5264)
 Succulent rosettes are topped by clusters of rainbow-hued flowers in late spring and early summer. This choice alpine requires excellent drainage. (10" x 36") Zn4.



Leymus (Elymus) condensatus 'Canyon Prince'
Dune Grass (Code: 2692)
 This medium-sized gray-blue grass has erect flower stalks that rise 1-2' above the foliage and are topped with spikes of wheat colored blooms. Drought tolerant and evergreen, it spreads by rhizomes, but is not invasive. (2-3' x 2-3') Zn7.



Leymus arenarius 'Findhorn'
Lyme Grass (Code: 6911)
 The lovely stiff, metallic blue-gray leaves will spread by means of underground rhizomes. It is excellent for banks and erosion control. (2' x 3') Zn4.



Lilium washingtonianum
Washington Lily (Code: 7649)
 Fragrant, trumpet-shaped pink flowers appear on tall stems, up to 20 per stem in summer. The flowers have red spots that fade to dark pink. Plant in the woodland garden. May need staking to keep the stems upright. Pacific Northwest native. (48-72" x 6-24") Zn6.



Limonium latifolium 'Blue Diamond'
Statice (Code: 3581)
 Delicate sprays of purple-blue flowers brighten up the garden on this florist's favorite. Excellent for dried arrangements or rock gardens. (10" x 8") Zn4.



Linum perenne 'Sapphire'
Blue Flax (Code: 3042)
 Sky-blue flowers bloom continuously late spring through summer. This dwarf plant looks deceptively delicate, with a wildflower appearance. A good cut flower too! (10" x 16") Zn5.



Liriope muscari 'Big Blue'
Lilyturf (Code: 3046)
 Spreading, grass-like foliage is topped by grape hyacinth-like flower spikes in late summer. It makes an excellent evergreen groundcover. (8-10" x 18") Zn6.



Liriope muscari 'Silvery Sunproof'
Lilyturf (Code: 6603)
 Leaves are green and white-striped in filtered sun, more green and yellow in shade. Lilac flower spikes appear late in the season. Spreads to form a low maintenance groundcover. (12-18" x 30-36") Zn6.



Lupinus 'Popsicle Mix'
Lupine (Code: 5846)
 This compact, sturdy and early blooming selection has stately flower spikes in reds, blues, purples, yellows and whites. Plant several for a vivid display of color! (18" x 18") Zn3.



Lupinus Russell Hybrids 'Chandelier'
Lupine (Code: 3069)
 Primrose-yellow flower spikes bloom above green palmate foliage. An excellent cut flower, great for mixed borders, it is also drought tolerant. (3' x 2') Zn3.



Lupinus Russell Hybrids 'My Castle'
Lupine (Code: 3063)
 Spires of brick-red flowers appear above palmate foliage in late spring. It makes a vibrant cut flower and grows best in dry, sunny locations. (3' x 2') Zn3.



Lupinus Russell Hybrids 'The Governor'
Lupine (Code: 3060)
 Beautiful spikes of blue and white flowers appear late spring and early summer. It makes an excellent addition for the cut flower garden. (3' x 2') Zn3.



Lupinus Russell Hybrids 'The Pages'
Lupine (Code: 3064)
 Cherry-red flowers on tall stalks adorn this lovely late spring bloomer. It makes a marvelous and vibrant cut bouquet, perfect for dry, sunny locations. (36" x 24") Zn3.



Mahonia nervosa
Cascade Oregon Grape Holly (Code: 7266)
 This low-growing NW native evergreen shrub spreads by rhizomes to form thickets. The evergreen leaflets have toothed edges and resemble holly foliage. Fragrant pale yellow flowers bloom in spring followed by blue berries in summer and fall. (18-24' x 2-4') Zn5.





Mahonia repens

Creeping Oregon Grape (Code: 6963)

Compound evergreen leaves look similar to holly. It forms a low-spreading groundcover with fragrant, small, yellow flowers that bloom from mid spring to early summer at the branch tips. This NW native is an excellent choice for dry shade. (12" x 30-36") Zn5.



Miscanthus oligostachyus 'Purpurascens'

Flame Grass, Eulalia (Code: 3117)

One of the best grasses for fall color! Silvery inflorescences appear above broad, reddish-purple leaves in autumn. The winter foliage is a rich bronze-brown. (3' x 2') Zn4.



Miscanthus sinensis 'Cosmopolitan'

Japanese Silver Grass (Code: 6829)

Vivid variegation! The leaf blades have wide, dazzling white edges. Coppery plumes appear in fall. This outstanding border accent is a "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6-8' x 4-5') Zn6.



Miscanthus sinensis 'Gold & Silver'

Maiden Grass (Code: 5548)

Slender, arching foliage produces golden flowers that turn silver with age. Creates a striking effect in fall. (5-6' x 3') Zn5.

Japanese Silver Grass (Code: 5776)

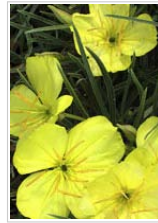

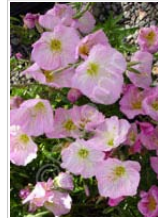

Osteospermum 'Side Show Golden Yellow'
African Daisy (Code: 7476)

Sedum 'Sunkissed'
Stonecrop (Code: 7032)
 This Sedum forms upright grayish/blue-green foliage that contrasts dramatically with creamy-yellow flowers; a novel flower color for an upright sedum! (12-18" x 12-18") Zn3. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.



Sedum 'Xenox'
Stonecrop (Code: 4027)
 A very garden-worthy, compact, bushy form of upright Sedum. Gray-purple foliage with pink flowers appear in September. This recent introduction is one of the best! (12-14" x 18") Zn3. PPAF Propagation Prohibited.





Sedum album 'Athoum'
Stonecrop (Code: 7645)
 Plump, round, evergreen leaves are much larger than the species and remain apple-green in winter. The leaves will often turn slightly red in the heat of summer when the white flowers appear. It's wonderful as a groundcover for sunny sites. (2-4" x 18-24") Zn4.



Sedum album 'Black Pearl'
White Flowering Stonecrop (Code: 6271)
 The creeping bronze-purple succulent evergreen foliage holds its color well into summer. White panicles appear in summer. It can be used in containers, rock gardens, trailing over rock walls or as a groundcover. (2-3" x 12-24") Zn4.



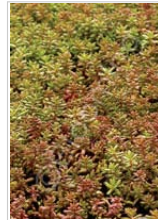
Sedum album 'Chloroticum'
Stonecrop (Code: 4581)
 Miniature, pale green, evergreen leaves brighten alpine planters or rock gardens. White starry flowers bloom in summer. (1-3" x 12") Zn3.



Sedum album 'Coral Carpet'
White Flowering Stonecrop (Code: 3467)

Stonecrop (Code: 3468)
 This low, spreading Sedum has attractive grayish-blue, rounded leaves. Rosy-purple flowers appear in July. A great choice for the rockery. (4-6" x 12") Zn5.



Sedum anglicum 'Love's Triangle'
Stonecrop (Code: 7700)
 Mats of tiny, powder blue leaves are topped by single, pale pink bloom in late spring and early summer. An excellent plant for the rock garden, alpine trough or between stepping stones. (1-2" x 6-12") Zn3.



Sedum bithynicum 'Sea Stars'
Turkish Stonecrop (Code: 6592)

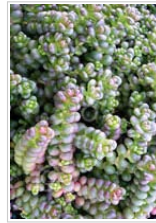




Sedum dasyphyllum 'Major'

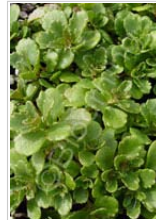

Fabulous contrast plant with bright golden foliage, very tiny leaves, and a low, creeping habit. Greenish-yellow flowers appear in summer. It grows best in filtered shade. (2" x 12") Zn6.





Sedum makinoi 'Variegata'

Stonecrop (Code: 4343)

This low-growing, mat-forming Sedum has small light green leaves with creamy-white edges. Yellow flowers appear in summer. An excellent choice for the rockery or containers. (1" x 12") Zn6.



Sedum nevi 'Pink Form'

Stonecrop (Code: 7699)

Sedum palmeri

Stonecrop (Code: 5313)

Sedum pluricaule 'Island of Sakhalin'

Stonecrop (Code: 5802)

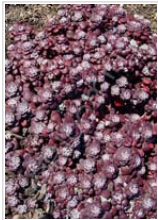

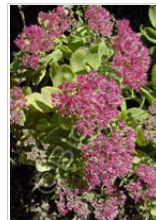

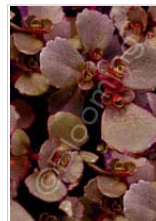

Sedum telephium 'Sunset Cloud'
Stonecrop (Code: 5924)

Sedum x 'Thundercloud'

Sempervivum arachnoideum 'Stansfieldii'

Cobweb Houseleek (Code: 3691)

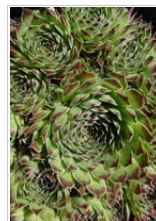

Sempervivum arachnoideum ssp. tomentosum

Hens & Chicks (Code: 3725)

Sesleria autumnalis

Autumn Moor Grass (Code: 3542)

Finely-textured light evergreen blades form a nice rounded clump that is drought tolerant. Tight creamy-white flower spikes appear late summer and persist into winter. It can be massed for a dramatic effect. (16" x 12") Zn5.



Sesleria caerulea

Blue Moor Grass (Code: 5544)

Attractive compact, evergreen grass displays both sea-blue & green leaf blades simultaneously. The low growing, dumping form makes this grass excellent for edging. (8" x 12") Zn4.



Solanum crispum 'Glasnevin'

Potato Bush (Code: 6692)

Clusters of yellow-eyed, purple "shooting star" flowers adorn this attractive shrub throughout summer. It needs winter protection in colder areas. (10' x 9') Zn7.

White Potato Vine (Code: 6150)

Solidago 'Crown of Rays'

Goldenrod (Code: 6828)

Impressive late bloomer with large sprays of tiny golden-yellow flowers. Beautiful and easy to grow, it makes a great cut flower! (24" x 18") Zn4.





Solidago canadensis 'Baby Gold'
Goldenrod (Code: 3567)
 Golden sprays of flowers in large curving panicles make this an essential garden addition for late summer color. Easy to grow. (24" x 18") Zn4.



Solidaster x luteus 'Lemore'
Golden Aster (Code: 5707)
 Hundreds of tiny lemon-yellow flowers in dense panicles cover deep green lanceolate leaves. A lovely late bloomer for cut flowers. (36" x 12-24") Zn6.



Stachys b. 'Countess Helen von Stein Zeppelin'
Lamb's Ear (Code: 5717)
 Felted silver, evergreen leaves resist rot more than many in this group and have distinct veining. Leaves are longer and broader than the species. It rarely blooms. (12" x 18-24") Zn4.



Stachys byzantina 'Primrose Heron'
Lamb's Ear (Code: 5716)
 Large, soft, chartreuse foliage is delightful in spring. The foliage later fades to silver. It adds a wonderful touch of color to the garden year-round. (12" x 18") Zn4.



Stachys byzantina 'Silky Fleece'
Lamb's Ear (Code: 3672)
 A dwarf form of lamb's ear, it forms a soft dense evergreen mat that will carpet well-drained soils. Short spikes of tiny plum-colored flowers appear in summer. (4-10" x 12-18") Zn4.



Stachys byzantina 'Silver Carpet'
Lamb's Ear (Code: 3573)
 Fuzzy, silvery, evergreen leaves are invaluable for providing nice foliage contrast in the mixed border. This variety rarely blooms, but has a nice low & spreading habit. (8" x 24") Zn4.



Stachys chrysantha
Lamb's Ear (Code: 4896)
 Round silvery-white woolly leaves add dramatic texture to the garden. Compact spikes of light creamy-yellow flowers appear in summer. (12" x 18-24") Zn7.



Stachys densiflora 'Rosea'
Betony (Code: 3574)
 Dense rosy spikes in summer. (1-2' x 1') Zn4.



Stachys monieri
Betony (Code: 3760)
 Grown for its flower, this Stachys has erect stems to 8", rising from neat low mounds of green foliage. Medium-pink flowers bloom over a long period. (8" x 10") Zn5.



Stipa gigantea
Giant Feather Grass (Code: 3578)
 Numerous golden seeds dangle from tall stiff stalks, creating an "aura" when back-lit. Magnificent as a specimen grass or for cut flower arrangements. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (6-9' x 3-6') Zn6.



Talinum calycinum
Flame Flower (Code: 3937)
 Purple-pink flowers on 10" stalks, open in the afternoon, May to September. Nice 4" succulent rosettes are perfect for the rockery. An American native! (8-16" x 10-12") Zn5.



Tanacetum coccineum 'Double Market'
Painted Daisy (Code: 3386)
 Large and colorful daisies bloom in a mix of brilliant shades that include red, rose, pink or white; all with yellow centers. (24" x 18") Zn3.



Tanacetum coccineum 'Duro'
Painted Daisy (Code: 3390)
 Large double, carmine-purple, daisy-like flowers dance above ferny green foliage. A bright, eye-catching selection for the mixed border. (24" x 18") Zn5.



Tanacetum coccineum 'Robinson's Red'
Painted Daisy (Code: 3388)
 Large red, double flowers shine above lacy green foliage. A knockout in the garden, and also great for cutting. Blooms appear June through August. (24" x 18") Zn5.



Tanacetum parthenium 'Aureum'
Feverfew (Code: 2403)
 Bright golden leaves are set off by 1" white daisies with yellow centers. This great container plant blooms from summer through fall. (2' x 2') Zn4.



Tanacetum vulgare 'Crispum'
Tansy (Code: 3587)
 Luxurious, finely-cut, bright green foliage makes a lovely foil for spring and summer blossoms. Small yellow button-like flowers emerge late summer. It may require staking. (30" x 24") Zn4.





Tanacetum vulgare 'Isla Gold'

Tansy (Code: 4868)

Brilliant gold, lacy foliage holds its color until frost. The button-like yellow flowers and gold foliage complement each other to excellent effect. It's easy to grow in full sun. (2' x 2") Zn4.



Teucrium chamaedrys

Germander (Code: 6522)

Neat little evergreen sub-shrub that can take trimming into mini-hedges or knot gardens. Glossy, deep green leaves and pretty lilac-pink flowers complete the picture. (15" x 15") Zn5.



Teucrium chamaedrys 'Nanum'

Germander (Code: 8237)

This lovely dwarf edging plant is an excellent addition to the herb garden. The glossy, evergreen, scallop-edged foliage is aromatic and contrasts beautifully with rosy-purple flowers. (6" x 12") Zn5.



Teucrium chamaedrys 'Summer Sunshine'

Germander (Code: 3764)

Beautiful bright golden, evergreen foliage has purple-pink flowers. A real eye-catcher that's sure to get lots of attention. Drought tolerant once established. (6-8" x 12-16") Zn5.



Teucrium fruticans 'Azureum'

Silver Germander (Code: 6684)

Vivid blue flowers contrast nicely against silvery-white leaves on this small evergreen shrub. It prefers a sunny, sheltered position in well-drained soil. (3-4' x 3") Zn7.



Thymus 'Gold Transparent'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3603)

Shimmering gold and green foliage grows low and fast for a sun-loving, hardy, evergreen groundcover. Lilac blooms appear late summer. (3" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus doerfleri 'Bressingham'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 5943)

A carpet of fuzzy gray-green, evergreen leaves and soft pink flowers makes it a dainty accent for the rockery, between pavers, or at borders edge. Best in full sun with good drainage. (4" x 18") Zn4.



Thymus herba-barona

Caraway Thyme (Code: 8245)

Dark green leaves have a delightful caraway scent and flavor. Good in culinary dishes; especially stir fry and meat. It's ideal for the rock garden. (4" x 16") Zn6.



Thymus praecox 'Albus'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3614)

Starry white flowers top tiny bright green leaves. It forms a fragrant, tightly-matted groundcover underfoot; perfect along pathways or between pavers. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Coccineus'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3612)

Dainty rose-red flowers completely cover this creeping thyme in summer. The evergreen foliage turns somewhat red in winter. (2-3" x 18") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Hartington Silver'

Silver Creeping Thyme (Code: 4709)

Creeping English thyme with beautiful, aromatic, tiny green leaves edged in gold. It makes an excellent mat-forming, evergreen groundcover or use between pavers. (2-3" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Minus'

Miniature Creeping Thyme (Code: 3615)

Tiny, overlapping, gray-green, evergreen leaves form a low mat. Small pink flowers appear midsummer. Nice for planting between pavers. (1" x 10") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Nutmeg'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 8256)

A profusion of deep purple-carmine blooms cover this tight, deep green, evergreen groundcover in summer. It is drought tolerant and sun loving. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus praecox 'Pink Chintz'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 3609)

Soft, hairy, gray-green, evergreen foliage is topped by pale pink flowers in summer. It's drought tolerant and sun loving. (1-3" x 12") Zn4.





Thymus praecox 'Reiter's Red'

Creeping Thyme (Code: 4449)

Rich olive-green, evergreen foliage grows thick and tough, making it an ideal groundcover or alternative for grass. Lavender-pink flowers add to its appeal mid-summer. (2-3" x 18") Zn5.



Thymus pseudolanuginosus

Woolly Thyme (Code: 3606)

Soft, completely prostrate, silvery-green, evergreen foliage has pink flowers in summer. It handles foot traffic well and is excellent for use between pavers. (1" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus pulegioides 'Foxy'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 4448)

Mounds of soft, shiny, cream & green-variegated evergreen foliage contrasts nicely with dark pink blooms in summer. Perfect in rockeries, along paths or the herb garden. (8" x 12") Zn7.



Thymus thracicus 'Lavender'

Lavender-Scented Thyme (Code: 5461)

Wonderful needle-leaved culinary thyme has a rich fragrance similar to lavender. It can also be used as a drought tolerant, evergreen groundcover. (10" x 18") Zn5.



Thymus vulgaris 'Dot Wells'

French Thyme (Code: 3759)

An upright grower ideal for the culinary garden. Pale pink flowers bloom from summer to fall over the very fragrant foliage. (6-12" x 12") Zn4.



Thymus vulgaris 'English Wedgewood'

French Thyme (Code: 5412)

This lovely mound-forming evergreen thyme has good flavor and is excellent for the culinary herb garden. Pink flowers appear in early summer. (9" x 14") Zn6.



Thymus vulgaris 'Narrow Leaf French'

French Thyme (Code: 5460)

Fine gray leaves hold small white flowers during the summer. Excellent flavor for cooking. It may also be used as an evergreen groundcover or rockery accent. (12" x 18") Zn6.



Thymus vulgaris 'Orange Balsam'

Orange Thyme (Code: 5531)

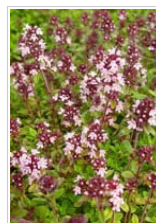

Thymus vulgaris 'Silver Posie'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 6860)

This beautiful thyme features fragrant deep green, evergreen leaves, each edged with a wide silvery-white margin. New growth appears with a nice rosy tinge. (6-10" x 18-24") Zn6.



Thymus x 'Pink Ripple'

Pink Ripple Thyme (Code: 5430)

Light green, lemon-scented foliage creates a spreading evergreen carpet topped by pink flowers in summer. An excellent choice for pathways, between pavers, or in the rockery. (6" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Archer's Gold'

Lemon Thyme (Code: 3602)

Creeping thyme with brilliant golden, evergreen foliage that is especially bright in winter and spring. Excellent between pavers or spilling around stones. (2" x 12") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Argentus'

Silver Variegated Lemon Thyme (Code: 8253)

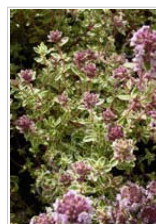
Glossy ivory and gray-green foliage adds interest to the rockery. This slow-growing variety has an excellent lemon flavor. (8" x 12") Zn5.

Gold Variegated Thyme (Code: 8251)

Thymus x citriodorus 'Doone Valley'

Variegated Thyme (Code: 5173)

Green foliage has irregular golden patches, which become red-tinted in winter. Fragrant lavender flowers appear from August through September. (4" x 12") Zn5.





Thymus x citriodorus 'Lemon Frost'

Lemon Thyme (Code: 4160)

This excellent selection exudes the sweet and pure fragrance of lemons when walked upon. Profuse white flowers provide the "frost" in June and July. An excellent choice for an evergreen groundcover or between pavers. (4" x 12") Zn6.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Lime'

Lime Thyme (Code: 3761)

Bright chartreuse leaves brighten up any garden. It has a lovely citrus scent and pink flowers. A nice plant to border pathways or as an evergreen groundcover. (4" x 12-16") Zn5.



Thymus x citriodorus 'Spicy Orange'

Citrus-Scented Thyme (Code: 6896)

This prostrate, needle-leaved thyme makes an excellent evergreen groundcover. Releasing a refreshing scent of oranges when crushed, it is perfect between pavers. (4" x 24") Zn5.



Verbascum 'Dark Eyes'

Mullein (Code: 4143)

Pale yellow spikes with large dark red centers bloom repeatedly. Large silver-green leaves have a rough texture and combines easily with other plants for the front of the border. (10-12" x 12") Zn5. PP16986, EU19206 Propagation Prohibited.



Verbascum 'Eleanor's Blush'

Mullein (Code: 7307)

A chance seedling with large, gray-green leaves and strong flower spikes of peachy-orange with lighter centers. Remove spent flowers for rebloom. (36-48" x 12-18") Zn5.



Verbascum 'Jackie in Pink'

Mullein (Code: 4029)

18" spires of pure pink blooms appear above large rosettes of foliage in summer and will rebloom if deadheaded. It performs best in well-drained soil. (18" x 12") Zn5. PP15735 Propagation Prohibited.



Verbascum 'Lavender Lass'

Mullein (Code: 3626)

An abundance of velvety lavender flowers top compact ruffled foliage. Loads of color! Requires good drainage and will rebloom if deadheaded. (9-24" x 14") Zn5. PP16658, PVR Propagation Prohibited.



Verbascum phoeniceum 'Violetta'

Mullein (Code: 4482)

Stunning dark purple candles rise above rosettes of fresh green leaves. Will rebloom all summer if spent flowers are removed. Prefers sun in well-drained soil. (3' x 2') Zn6.



Verbena 'Homestead Purple'

Verbena (Code: 5227)

Rich dark purple flowers appear all summer long and are very attractive to butterflies! The dark green spreading foliage is mildew resistant. It's very vigorous and trouble-free. (8-16" x 24-36") Zn7.



Verbena 'Lapis Lazuli Blue'

Verbena (Code: 5215)

Clusters of brilliant deep blue-purple flowers provide non-stop color spring until frost! It has a cascading habit that is a perfect choice for planters. (6-10" x 12") Zn7.



Verbena 'Rapunzel Lilac'

Verbena (Code: 7846)

Large clusters of self cleaning lilac-purple blooms on this semi-trailing variety of Verbena. Prize pick for hanging baskets, containers or sunny borders. (5-10" x 8-12") Zn10.



Verbena 'St. Paul' ('Sissinghurst')

Verbena (Code: 3749)

Showy green foliage is covered with hot pink flowers in early spring. Perfect for retaining walls or between stepping stones. It forms a low-growing mat. (6" x 24-36") Zn7.



Veronica 'Reavis' ('Crystal River')

Speedwell (Code: 6666)

This evergreen groundcover form is both heat tolerant and vigorous. It grows rapidly and covers the garden with small, true blue flowers in mid-spring. (2-3" x 18-36") Zn4.



Yucca filamentosa 'Bright Edge'

Adam's Needle (Code: 4328)

Succulent green leaves have sunny-gold margins and form large, spiky, drought tolerant rosettes. Tall, dangling clusters of white blooms are dramatic and showy. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (4' x 3') Zn4. PPAF Propagation Prohibited





Yucca filamentosa 'Color Guard'

Adam's Needle (Code: 3247)

A brilliant gold stripe accentuates the center of each broad green leaf. At its best in late summer. Fragrant creamy-white flowers appear late spring above rose-blushed leaves. A "Great Plant Pick" for the Pacific Northwest! (3' x 3') Zn5.



Yucca gloriosa var. recurvifolia 'Bright Star'

Adam's Needle (Code: 6012)

Tri-colored, sword-like, evergreen foliage forms a rosette in shades of ivory, pink and green. Lavender flowers rise above the drought tolerant blades in summer. (36" x 36") Zn7. PP17653 Propagation Prohibited.



Yucca rostrata 'Sapphire Skies'

Yucca (Code: 7630)

Stunning, long, powder-blue leaves quickly grow into a three-by-four-foot mound. With some age it will begin rising on a stout trunk to a height of four feet or more. At maturity, spectacular spires of ivory flowers appear in summer. The foliage is greener when young. Requires excellent drainage. (4-6' x 4-6') Zn6.
