### **TERMS of BUSINESS**

**Important - Please Read This:** Most parcels are sent via. FedEx and are usually delivered by express parcel vans during working hours on weekdays only, not by the normal postman. In case no one is in, it is important that you fill in the 'Delivery Instructions' box at the bottom of the order form. Please describe briefly where you would like the parcel left, or give an alternative delivery address nearby. The driver will also put a card in your letter-box. These instructions are sent to the FedEx computer, as well as appearing on the label, enabling the driver to leave the parcel without signature, rather than return it to the Depot.

Channel Isles orders will be sent International Standard, Northern Ireland, Highlands & Islands, I.O.M. & Scillies orders will be sent by Royal Mail Standard service, Courier surcharges to these areas are higher than ever and the service no faster in our experience. Prices as tabled below.

If you will be away in March, April or May, please let us know & we will avoid sending your parcel just before, or whilst you are away.

**E.C. orders (excl. Channel Isles):** Sent via. EuroExpress. Minimum order value of plants &70. If you want to pay by credit card, include the details on the order form but please do not send payment with your order, as soon as I know what plants I am able to supply, I will send a confirmation of your order and invoice. There is no easy formula for working out the postage cost.

**Non E.C. Export Orders:** We no longer accept orders from outside the E.C.

**Payment:** Payment with order please, cheques payable to Elizabeth MacGregor. If you want to pay by card we will not charge your card account until dispatch of the order, but please note that for Credit Cards we make a surcharge of 3% to cover the additional cost. Debit or Maestro cards are not surcharged

All orders received by the beginning of March will be acknowledged. I will try to acknowledge later orders. Orders from N.T. & N.T.S. Gardens on official order forms will be invoiced on dispatch. Carriage on orders not prepaid will be invoiced at cost.

**Dispatch:** Please note that orders are only sent during March, April and May. No autumn deliveries. Orders are dealt with in order of

receipt. I will send an email or postcard when your parcel is dispatched, this will enable you to make enquiries if your parcel is delayed. As you will imagine, by March there is a long queue of orders to be sent, please be patient and only phone if really necessary. Orders can be collected from the nursery, we will let you know when your order is ready for collection.

**Prices:** All Violas, Violettas & Violets are priced at \$3.00 per plant. Other plants priced individually. Minimum order is for six plants in total. These prices will be held until the end of October 2009, so orders made before then, for Spring 2010 delivery, are at Spring 2009 prices.

**Substitutes:** This catalogue is produced after plants have been propagated for next year, so that early in the season, everything listed should be available. Please tick the boxes on your order form to let me know your preference if any plant should be sold out. A list of soldouts is available on the website, or I can send a list by return, if you send a s.a.e., or by fax if you phone or fax.

**Postage & Packing:** All plants are in half litre pots or larger, carriage charges reduce proportionally for larger orders. For UK including the Channel Isles, use the table below to work out the amount to add for p&p.



**Collection of 10 Violas £26.00 + p&p.** Violas must have one of the longest flowering seasons of all plants, beginning in May and continuing well into the Autumn. Easy to grow in rich, well-drained soil, they look wonderful at the front of an herbaceous border or beneath shrub roses, and are superb in raised beds, containers, or on the rockery.

**Collection of 6 Asters &22.50 + p&p.** Asters are indispensable for prolonging colour in the border well into Autumn, and make excellent cut flowers. Easy and vigorous plants, to grow in sun or part shade.

**Collection of 6 Campanulas &22.50 + p&p.** Campanulas are the very essence of the English flower border. They are breathtakingly beautiful in association with old shrub roses and other herbaceous plants, providing colour and interest from early Summer onwards.

### Viola 'Alethia'

Strong grower, producing a profusion of rich lavender-blue flowers, yellow eye.

### Viola 'Ardross Gem'

Beautiful blue & gold flowers, 2.5cm. across. Very compact foliage which forms neat evergreen mats, 30cm. across on an established plant.

### Viola 'Aspasia' AGM

Lovely elongated flowers 2cm. across, top petals creamy white, lower petals deep yellow. Very floriferous, scented plant, forming a large clump.

### Viola 'Columbine'

Exquisite viola with scented white flowers, heavily striped with blue. Vigorous compact habit. Very lovely & highly recommended.

### Viola 'Desdemona'

Tiny pale blue & white flowers. Vigorous, makes a large clump.

### Viola 'Devon Cream'

(EM) Exquisitely shaped flowers of a soft cream colour, faint rays & a lovely scent.

### Viola 'Eastgrove Blue Scented'

Very scented mid-blue flowers, 4.5cm. across. Very vigorous perennial habit, spreading 50cm. or more. Originated at Eastgrove Cottage Nursery in Worcestershire.

### Viola 'Fabiola'

Tiny 2cm. lavender-blue flowers in profusion. Orange eye. Very vigorous and perennial, making compact neat clumps.

### Viola 'Fiona'

Very scented white flowers slightly flushed with pale blue. Excellent vigorous perennial habit.

### Viola 'Glenholme'

(EM) Exceptionally good new cultivar with pale yellow, orange-eyed flowers. The best yellow Viola I've come across for vigour & flower power. Almost certainly a seedling of V. 'Ivory Queen'

(EM) - Raised by Elizabeth MacGregor (PBR) - Plant breeders rights apply.

### Viola 'Inverurie Beauty' AGM

An exceptionally hardy and perennial Viola of Scottish origin, with large, deep violet-purple flowers. Makes excellent ground cover, clumps to 50cm across.

### Viola 'Irish Molly'

Bronzy-yellow flowers with a copper centre, 4cm. across. A very unusual old variety.

### Viola 'Jane Mott'

Scented creamy-white flowers with a yellow eye. Vigorous and perennial.

### Viola 'Judy Goring'

Bright lemon-yellow scented flowers from early summer 'till autumn. Reputed to be the best and most perennial yellow Viola.

### Viola 'Julian'

Slightly frilled flowers, 3cm. across, of a beautiful clear mid-blue with a yellow eye. Flowers so profusely the foliage is entirely covered. Makes neat compact clumps.

### Viola 'Juno'

Elongated deep purple flowers with a white eye. Very vigorous & perennial. Makes enormous clumps.

### Viola 'Kitty White'

Vigorous and long lived perennial habit, masses of blue flowers fading to white in the centre, from May until the frosts. *Plate G* 

### Viola 'Louisa'

A strongly scented Viola, purple flowers suffused with dusky pink and a contrasting yellow eye. Unusual and vigorous. Clumps 35-40cm. across.

### Viola 'Maggie Mott' AGM

Highly scented silvery-mauve flowers with a cream centre, 5cm. across. A very free flowering & popular old variety.

### Viola 'Martin' AGM

Lovely deep violet-blue flowers with a yellow eye. 3cm. across. Very neat perennial habit.

### Viola 'Mauve Radiance'

Deep lavender-mauve flowers 4cm. across with yellow eye. A very vigorous & long lived plant. Very useful where a simple pure colour is required.

### Viola 'May Mott'

Very similar to 'Maggie Mott' & probably a seedling. The upper petals pale silvery-blue, lower petals cream edged with pale blue. Flowers profusely & is very scented.

### Viola 'Mrs Lancaster'

Lovely pure white flowers, 3cm. across, with yellow eye. Possessing an exceptionally strong perfume. Seems happy growing in quite deep shade as long as it has enough moisture.

### Viola 'Myfawnny'

A very pretty Viola, the scented flowers attractively marbled pale lavender and white.

### Viola 'Pasha'

(EM) Lovely new Viola producing a profusion of flowers in an unusual bright dusky pink enhanced by maroon rays. Makes a good clump.

### Viola 'Petra'

A mound of tiny pale blue, yellow-eyed flowers all summer. Very profuse flowering with a strong perennial habit.

### Viola 'Roscastle Black'

Vigorous, perennial clump former with numerous elongated navy-black flowers enhanced by a yellow eye.

### Viola 'Vanessa'

(EM) Masses of soft lilac-pink flowers, enhanced by a maroon central blotch.

### Viola 'Vita'

Pale pink flower, 3cm. across with a yellow eye. Originated at Sissinghurst Castle.

### Viola 'Wasp'

(EM) V. 'Jackanapes' seedling and even more enchanting. A similar combination of yellow & mahogany brown but with added mahogany blotches on the three lower petals.

### Viola 'Woodlands Cream'

Large circular scented flowers, rich cream when first opening, becoming striped with pale blue. The combination of cream & striped flowers together is lovely. Vigorous old variety.

# VIOLETTA

### Violetta 'Buttercup'

Deep yellow, sweetly-scented flowers, 2.5cm. across, produced very freely over neat compact foliage.

### Violetta 'Cinders'

(EM) A lovely little plant with scented bicoloured flowers, buttercup yellow centre surrounded with soft purple. Neat clumps, 20cm. across.

### Violetta 'Little David' AGM

Creamy-white slightly frilled flowers, 3cm. across. Vigorous & long lived plant, strongly scented.

### Violetta 'Raven'

(EM) Velvety, very deep purple (near black) flowers with striking yellow eye. Very vigorous low spreading mats.

### Violetta 'Rebecca'

Exquisite, frilled, creamy-white viola edged & heavily flecked with dark lavender-blue. Strongly scented.

### **VIOLA CORNUTA**

The following cornuta species are very hardy perennial plants. They will form large clumps which may easily be increased by division. Ideal for rockeries or at the front of herbaceous borders.

### Viola cornuta 'Alba' AGM

A very vigorous white form. Excellent ground cover, even in shade. Seeds itself in the most inhospitable places in the garden.

### Viola cornuta 'Belmont Blue'

Lovely very pale sky-blue flowers, 2.5cm. across, all summer. Very vigorous & makes good ground cover.

### Viola cornuta 'Blue Butterfly'

(EM) Dainty pale blue flowers, enhanced by a bright orange eye. Has a vigorous compact habit, a lovely new cultivar.

### Viola cornuta 'Boughton Blue'

Nearly identical to V. c. 'Belmont Blue', with slightly fuller flower. Excellent vigorous habit.

### Viola cornuta 'Brimstone'

(EM) Soft subtle colouring of pale cream delicately overlaid & veined with pale slatey-blue.

### Viola cornuta 'Butterpat'

(EM) A new V. cornuta which appeared in our nursery garden, a seedling from V. c. 'Pat Kavanagh'. Typical elongated cornuta shaped flowers, rich yellow with a few delicate dark rays, paler reverse and a violet spur. Strongly scented.

### Viola cornuta 'Cleopatra'

(EM) Superb new cultivar making a large perennial clump to 50cm. across. Scented, pale cream flowers with contrasting deep violet rays and spur.

### Viola cornuta 'Clouded Yellow'

(EM) Beautiful combination of pale creamy yellow overlaid with pale slatey-blue streaks and veins. A lovely and most unusual cultivar.

### Viola cornuta 'Gypsy Moth'

(EM) A good cultivar with a typical cornuta elongated flower shape. Upper petals very pale blue, lower petals creamy white. Vigorous long-lived habit.

### Viola cornuta 'Kitten'

Pale blue flowers veined with navy-blue whiskers. Excellent vigorous perennial habit.

### Viola cornuta 'Maiden's Blush'

An excellent new cultivar, probably a sport from V. c. 'Victoria Cawthorne'. Produces a mass of very pale blush-pink and cream flowers all summer. A lovely new colour.

### Viola cornuta 'Minor' AGM

A lovely miniature cornuta only 8-10cm. high, but with a spreading habit. Pale mauve flowers 2cm. across.

### Viola cornuta 'Minor Alba'

Very compact form of V. c. 'Alba', 15cm. high. Very floriferous producing a mass of tiny white flowers all summer

### Viola cornuta 'Pale Apollo'

(EM) Excellent new cultivar producing large cream flowers which gradually become suffused with pale blue at the edges. Makes a large floriferous perennial clump.

### Viola cornuta 'Spider'

(EM) Excellent new cultivar with elongated 'Spidery' deep lavender purple petals. Has a carpeting habit similar to cornuta minor cultivars from which it almost certainly originates. 15cm. high.

### Viola cornuta 'Victoria Cawthorne'

Striking deep pink flowers in profusion all summer & autumn. One of the most beautiful of all Violas to appear in recent years.

### Viola cornuta 'Victoria's Blush'

(EM) A lovely new cultivar, a seedling from V. c. 'Victoria Cawthorne'. The palest possible pink, deeper in the centre with dark maroon whiskers. Typical vigorous cornuta habit.

### Viola cornuta violacea

A very vigorous Viola, deep violet-mauve flowers held on long stems. I find this the best and most perennial purple cornuta.

### Viola cornuta 'Winona Cawthorne'

Flowers in a very pleasing combination of pale-blue & cream. Typical vigorous cornuta ĥabit.

### **VIOLA ODORATA**

'Sweet Violets' should be planted in partial shade and moisture retentive soil. To obtain the best blooms, runners should be removed regularly.

### Viola odorata 'Large Flowered Blue'

Highly scented, large lavender-blue flowers. held well above the foliage.

### Viola odorata 'Queen Charlotte'

A compact variety with numerous, highly scented mid-blue flowers.

### Viola odorata 'Rosea'

Sweetly scented, very pale pink form.

### **COTTAGE GARDEN PLANTS** ACHILLEA Achillea millefolium £ 4.10 'Appleblossom'

Soft rose-pink flowers beautifully set off by the grey-green foliage. Easy in sun with good drainage. 75cm. high. (Syn. Achillea m.'Apfelblüte')

Achillea millefolium 'Red Velvet' \$4.10 Very deep cherry-red flowers on 60cm. stems, easily grown in full sun and free draining soil.

### Achillea 'Pretty Belinda' £ 4.10 Lovely compact new cultivar producing strong upright stems carrying bright pink flowers, all summer to autumn, especially if dead-headed. For sun and good drainage. 50cm. Plate A

### ALCEA

Alcea x Althaea 'Parkallee' £ 4.10 Fantastic new Hollyhock hybrid producing pale creamy-yellow, semi-double flowers with a con-

trasting central boss of dark maroon stamens. Very long flowering, July to November. Best in sun and ordinary soil. 1.8 metres high. Much more perennial and far less susceptible to rust than usual Hollyhocks. Plate A

Alcea x Althaea 'Parkrondell' £ 4.10 Fantastic new Hollyhock hybrid, hairy grevgreen lobed leaves and numerous spikes of semi-double deep pink flowers. Looks especially good September - October and into November. Sun and ordinary soil. 2m. Plate A

### Alcea 'Apple Blossom'

A new Hollyhock with very double pom-pom flowers in a lovely soft apple blossom pink. 1.5-1.8m. high.

### Alcea pallida

Grey-green lobed and tall stems of single lilac-rose flowers from June to September. 1.8-2m.

### Alcea rosea

### 'Chater's Double Icicle'

Spectacular Hollyhock with large pure-white double flowers held on tall stems. Fantastic for the back of the border. 1.5-1.8m. high.

### **ALCHEMILLA**

### Alchemilla vetteri

Rarely grown dwarf species. Nice for ground cover, typical lime green flowers. 15-20cm.

### AMSONIA

Amsonia tabernaemontana £ 4.10 Good long-lived perennial with strong upright willow-like stems holding slatev-blue starry flowers. 60cm. high.

# **ANEMONE SPECIES**

### Anemone barbulata

Like a smaller and more delicate version of Anemone rivularis, lovely. 30cm. high.

### Anemone flaccida

Very rewarding plant for a cool shady position or woodland edge. Soft brown, beautifully marked foliage & pure white single flowers in spring and early summer. 15-30cm. high.

### Anemone leveillei

Branching stems carry lilac backed white flowers in profusion. Similar to A. rivularis but larger in both leaf and flower. 60cm. Plate A

Anemone nemorosa 'Alba Plena' £ 4.10 Exquisite rosette of pure white very double flowers 15cm. high. Good coloniser beneath shrubs or trees. In flower March to May.

Anemone obtusiloba alba £ 4.10 Exquisite long flowering Anemone with yellow-centred white flowers, flushed dark blue on the reverse. In flower continuously from May to September. 20cm. high.

### Anemone pavonina £ 4.10 Showy early flowering Anemone for a well-

drained sunny spot. Large vivid-red single flowers February to April. 25cm. Plate A

£ 4.10 Anemone ranunculoides Vigorous spreading wood-Anemone with bright vellow flowers in spring. 10cm high.

### Anemone rivularis £ 4.10 A favourite anemone with upright branching stems carrying masses of blue-backed white flowers with contrasting blue anthers. Looks especially good planted in drifts, in naturalistic planting. Easy in any soil. 50-60cm. high.

Anemone rupicola £ 4.30 Very attractive plant for a well drained position in the rock garden. Large white silky flowers held well above the foliage during July & August. 30cm. high.

### Anemone sylvestris £ 4.50 'Elise Fellmann'

Rare double white form of the 'Snowdrop Anemone'. Spreading slowly to make a clump. Flowering April to June. For well drained humus rich soil in sun or part shade. 30cm. high.

### Anemone trullifolia £ 4.50

Clumps of soft green foliage produce the most exquisite blue flowers, varying in shade from palest sky-blue to deep, almost royal-blue. Flowers profusely in early summer, then intermittently until autumn. Easily grown in fertile and not too dry soils, in sun or part shade. 15-20cm. high.

Anemone trullifolia alba £ 4.50 As beautiful as the blue form, with vellow centred white flowers, dark blue on the reverse.

# Japanese Anemones

There are few plants more lovely in late summer & autumn than the Japanese Anemones. Spreading quickly in compost enriched soils they are equally happy in sun or part shade. Strong stems carry masses of golden centred flowers in shades of pink & white, from early August until the frosts.

Anemone hupehensis 'Hadspen Abundance' AGM

Deep pink flowers on 60cm, high stems in late summer & autumn.

Earlier flowering with large very pale creamypink flowers in abundance. From late July until autumn. 80-100cm. high.

Anemone hybrida 'Rosenschale' £ 4.10 Very choice, with large single, very deep pink bowl shaped flowers from early August to the end of autumn. Easy and vigorous. 70cm. high. Plate A

Anemone hybrida 'Seranade' £ 4.10 Soft pink semi-double flowers. Lovely. 70cm. high.

Anemone hybrida 'Whirlwind' £ 4.10 A excellent compact cultivar, with pure-white semi-double flowers. 60cm. high.

### Anemone tomentosa 'Robustissima'

An extremely vigorous colonizer which produces an abundance of soft pink flowers from July until autumn, 3 or 4 weeks earlier than other Japanese Anemones. 120cm. Plate A

# **ANEMONOPSIS**

# Anemonopsis macrophylla

Tall leafless stems carry very pale lilac waxy flowers. Very choice in cool shade and humusrich soil. 60cm. high.

# **ANTHEMIS**

The following Anthemis cultivars are indispensable garden plants, continuously and profusely flowering from early summer until the autumn frosts. They grow best in full sun and well-drained soil.

### Anthemis cupaniana AGM

Mounds of silver foliage covered in masses of single white daisies. 30cm. high.

Anthemis nobilis 'Flore Pleno' £ 4.10 A lovely form of camomile which makes mats of fresh-green, intensely aromatic ferny foliage topped by very double white pom-pom flowers in mid-summer. 12cm. high.Syn. Chamaemelumn 'Flore Pleno'

Anthemis 'Susanna Mitchell' £ 4.10 An excellent form with silvery foliage and large creamy-primrose daisies. 50cm. high.

### Anthemis tinctoria £ 4.10 'E. C. Buxton' A lovely old cultivar with cool lemon-vellow

flowers. 60cm. high.

### Anthemis tinctoria £ 4.10 'Pride of Grallach' Large rich-yellow single daisies on this reliable

old cultivar. 60cm. high.

### Anthemis tinctoria £ 4.10 'Sauce Hollandaise'

Dwarf & bushy habit with very pale creamywhite flowers 40cm tall

Anthemis tinctoria 'Wargrave' £ 4.10 Excellent very free flowering form producing pale creamy-yellow daisies all summer. 60cm. high.

Artemisia absinthium £ 4.10 'Lambrook Mist' AGM

Essentially a fabulous silver foil for other plantings with deeply divided pure silver silky foliage, on strong upright stems. Like all silvers, prefers sun and good drainage. 60cm. high.

### Artemisia arborescens £ 4.10 'Faith Raven'

Lovely lacy silver foliage plant for dry gardens. makes a bushy clump to 50cm. high.



Rudbeckia fulgida var. deamii £ 4.10 Strong upright stems of vivid vellow daisies with contrasting black central cones. Taller and more airy effect than R. 'Goldsturm'. Flowers profusely from August to end October. 90cm. Plate F

### Rudbeckia maxima

Very different from other Rudbeckia. Clumps of broad glaucous grey-green basal leaves.

Tall upright stems carry flowers composed of golden drooping petals surrounding a long black central cone. 120cm. high.

### SALVIA

£ 4.50 Salvia glutinosa Clump forming perennial with large heart shaped leaves. Attractively marked pale vellow flowers held on 90cm. stems from mid-summer to mid-autumn. Sun, in ordinary soil.

# **SANGUISORBA**

Sanguisorba menziesii

Clumps of elegant pinnate foliage produce 80cm. spikes of deep maroon bottle-brush flowers from May to July. Easy in ordinary soil, not too dry, in sun of part shade.

# **SAPONARIA**

Saponaria officinalis 'Betty Arnold' & 4.10 Pure white double flowers on 60cm. stems. Can be invasive, but excellent late summer and autumn flowering.

### **SCABIOSA**

Scabiosa caucasica 'Kompliment' £ 4.10 Large flowered, dark lavender form. For sun and good drainage. 60cm. high.

Scabiosa caucasica 'Perfecta' £ 4.10 Strong grower with large lavender-blue flowers. For sun and good drainage. 50cm. high

Scabiosa caucasica 'Perfecta Alba' £ 4.10 Large white flowers all summer.80cm. high. Well drained sunny spot.

# **SCHIZOSTYLIS**

The 'Kaffir Lily' makes a wonderful display in the autumn garden, coming into flower in September and continuing until November. The silky textured flowers resemble miniature Gladiolus, and are held on spikes 30-45cm. high. They prefer rich moist soil and full sun. Very vigorous, quickly making a spreading mat that will benefit from division every few years.

### Schizostylis coccinea alba £ 4.10

This rare pure white form of the Kaffir Lily makes large clumps of sword-like leaves. Flowers produced from September to November. A very good cut flower. 45cm. high.

Schizostylis coccinea 'Big Moma' £ 4.10 Large mid-pink flowers of good substance. Tall and vigorous. 60cm. high. Plate G

### Schizostylis coccinea 'Elburton Glow'

Glowing deep-salmon-pink. Excellent floriferous habit. 50cm. high.

Schizostylis coccinea 'Major' AGM £ 4.10 Large flowers in a beautiful luminous crimsonred. Indispensable for the autumn garden. 50cm. high.

### Schizostylis coccinea 'Oregon Sunset'

Vibrant dark salmon-pink flowers through late summer and autumn. Very good clump former. 60cm. high.

Schizostylis coccinea 'Pink Marge' £ 4.10

Neat pointed pink flowers attractively marked with darker pink flecks. September to November. 45cm. high. Plate G

Schizostylis coccinea 'Salome' £ 4.10 Large flowers in a beautiful luminous dark pink. Autumn flowering, earlier than most. 50cm. high.

Schizostylis coccinea 'Zeal Salmon' & 4.10 Stems of large, deep-salmon-pink flowers from the end of August until frosts. 50cm. high. Plate G

# **SENECIO**

# Senecio polyodon

£ 4.30 Vigorous carpet forming plant which produces erect slender stems, carrying rosy-purple daisy like flowers with a yellow central disc. Summer to early autumn. Best in sun and well drained soil. 30cm. high

# **SIDALCEA**

Sidalcea 'Elsie Heugh'

A beautiful perennial for a sunny border, producing spikes of pale pastel pink flowers with delicate fringed petals. July - Aug. 90cm.

# Sidalcea 'Sussex Beauty'

Spikes of glowing pink satiny flowers, produced profusely from July to September. Vigorous and strong grower, 90cm. high. Best in sun and fertile soil.

# SILENE

Silene 'Rolley's Favorite' £ 4.10 Vigorous new hybrid producing a continuous display of bright pink flowers. Spring to autumn if dead-headed. 40cm. high.

# **SOLIDASTER**

x Solidaster luteus 'Lemore' AGM £ 4.10 Wiry stems carry open heads of tiny lemonvellow daisies from July onwards. A very pleasing border plant, excellent for cutting. 60cm. high.

# **THALICTRUM**

### Thalictrum actaeifolium £ 4.30

One of the most beautiful species with distinctive Actaea like foliage. Tall stems carry largish pale lilac-white fluffy flowers. Rich fertile soil. 50-60cm. high. Plate F

North American species having tall upright stems flushed maroon-red and carrying large heads of palest lavender flowers. Foliage turns yellow in autumn and looks fantastic against the red stems. 1.5-1.8 metres high.

Very showy plants with beautiful maidenhair foliage and deep lilac-purple flowers for a long late-summer season. 100cm. high.

### Thalictrum delavayi AGM £ 4.10

(Syn. T. dipterocarpum) From beautiful maidenhair foliage arise 120cm. high stems carrying masses of tiny lilac flowers with prominent creamy stamens.

Very beautiful and rarely available species. Very large lilac flowers, 4cm, across, above clumps of grey-green glaucous foliage. Can be difficult to establish in the garden, but thrives in a container with gritty compost for me. 70-80cm. high.

### Thalictrum 'Elin'

The most robust and tallest is this outstanding hybrid between T. flavum glaucum & T. rochebrunianum. Produces sturdy stems 3 metres high, topped with sprays of bi-coloured lavender & yellow flowers. June to August.

Thalictrum filamentosum £ 4.30 Another beautiful species with lilac buds opening to fluffy white flowers on a compact bushy plant. long flowering season from early May to early August. 40-50cm. high. Easy in ordinary fertile soil, sun or part shade. Plate F

Thalictrum kiusianum £ 4.10 Miniature woodland species from Japan, making little spreading clumps of fluffy, rosy-purple flowers in June to August. For rock garden or trough, leafy humus rich soil, part shade. 12-15cm. high.

Thalictrum reniforme £ 4.10 Large pinky lilac flowers filled with cream stamens over clumps of beautifully shaped ferny foliage. Flowers June to August. 80-90cm. high.

Thalictrum rochebruneanum £ 4.10 One of the strongest Thalictrum species with large clumps of glaucous, purple-tinted foliage. Very tall stout upright stems carry a mass of soft-purple flowers filled with yellow stamens. 150cm. high. Plate F

Thalictrum sphaerostachyum £ 4.10 Robust species making clumps of glaucous grey-green foliage and 120cm. stems, carrying large terminal pannicles of sulphur-yellow flowers in July and August.

Thalictrum x 'Splendide' £ 4.50 New hybrid between T. delevayi and T. elegans producing tall vigorous red stems carrying a mass of soft purple flowers filled with cream stamens. 1.3m. high

### **TRADESCANTIA**

# **TRICYRTIS**

Upright stems carry pale-lilac flowers heavily spotted with dark maroon and marked yellow in the throat. Quickly forms a large hardy clump in humus-rich soil. 70cm, high.

### **TRIFOLIUM**

**Trifolium rubens** £ 4.10 One of the showiest clover species. Numerous upright stems holding large cylindrical bottlebrush flower spikes in a lovely reddish-purple shade. Easy in ordinary soil and sun. 60cm.

### TRITONIA

Tritonia disticha subs. rubrolucens £ 4.10 A very graceful addition to the late summer garden. Grassy clumps produce wiry stems of delicate warm-pink tubular lily-like flowers. Tough easy habit belied by its delicate appearance. Prefers sun. 60cm. high. Plate G







# **VERONICA**

### Veronica gentianoides 'Barbara Sherwood'

A beautiful cultivar, much larger in leaf & flower than the type. Cool pale blue flower spikes in early summer. 50cm. high. Plate G

Veronica gentianoides 'Robusta' £ 4.10 An excellent form, coming into flower slightly earlier than others in this group. Makes spreading clumps with soft blue flowers in early summer. 45cm. high.

### Veronica gentianoides £ 4.10 'Tissington White'

Not actually white but the palest possible blue. In flower a little later than the others in this group, & repeat flowering in early Autumn. Very neat evergreen spreading habit. 45cm.

Veronica longifolia 'Lilac Fantasy' £ 4.10 Upright lilac-blue flower spikes in July to August, ordinary soil in sun or part shade. 55cm. high.

# **VERONICASTRUM**

### Veronicastrum virginicum £ 4.10 'Album'

Slender graceful white spikes on bronzed stems create a delightful vertical effect, from July to end September. Easy in any soil, sun or part shade. 130cm. high.

### Veronicastrum virginicum £ 4.10 'Pink Glow'

A lovely clump-forming perennial, producing tall upright stems of slender soft-pink flower spikes in late summer & autumn. Good for a strong vertical effect. 120cm. high.

# WALDSTEINIA

### Waldsteinia ternata

Totally weed suppressing, vigorous, semi-evergreen ground cover for woodland or dry banks. Bright yellow flowers in late spring and early summer. 15cm. high.

# WATSONIA

Watsonia 'Stanford Scarlet' £ 4.50 Spectacular spikes of scarlet flowers in late spring and summer. Good perennial for a sheltered sunny frost-free site. 90cm. high.
