### **Ramstein runs for Haiti**

eam Ramstein did not let inclement weather stop them from running hard to raise money for disaster relief operations in Haiti with a 5K run Feb. 5 on Ramstein.

The Haiti earthquake struck more than a month ago, but this was the first official fundraiser Ramstein has held.

"We have more than 200 people who showed up today and have raised over \$8,000 in relief for Haiti," Sergeant Newland said.

Seventeenth Air Force Commander Maj. Gen. Ronald R. Ladnier and his team of advisers and support personnel kicked off the visit with a C-130J

## Ramstein Airman among Sijan award winners

RANDOLPH AIR FORCE BASE, Texas — Air Force officials have recognized four Airmen with the service's 2009 Lance P. Sijan Air Force Leadership Award.

The Sijan award annually recognizes Airmen who demonstrate outstanding leadership abilities. The junior officer category winner is Capt. Rachel M. Phillips, who is assigned to Sembach with the Air Force Office of Special Investigations.

Captain Phillips expertly developed, planned and executed robust strategic-level counter-intelligence operations to neutralize hostile intelligence and terrorist groups.

During her last deployment, Captain Phillips led more than 50 missions into hostile territory in Afghanistan, which resulted in the elimination of seven Taliban leaders from the battlefield. The Lance P. Sijan award was first presented in 1981. It is named in honor of the first U.S. Air Force Academy graduate to receive the Medal of Honor.

Captain Sijan was shot down over Vietnam on Nov. 9, 1967, and evaded capture for 45 days despite severe injuries. He later died while in a Vietnamese prisoner-of-war camp and was presented the Medal of Honor post-humously for his heroism.

# Exercise tests 7th CSC's ability to rapidly deploy

Rain, sleet and snow and below-freezing temperatures did not prevent the Soldiers of the 7th Civil Support Command's Incident Management Team from participating in Bavarian Thunder 2010, a training exercise that culminated Jan. 25 to 28 at the Deployment Processing Center on Rhine Ordnance Barracks. This exercise focused on deployment of personnel, equipment and vehicles.

The 7th CSC's IMT, along with Commanding General Brig. Gen. Jimmie Jaye Wells and Soldiers from supporting units, including the 1172nd Movement Control Team, the 406th Human Resources Command, the 773rd Civil Support Team and the 457th Civil Affairs Battalion, participated in the exercise to hone and expedite

deployment procedures of the command and control entity within an austere environment.

"The training is valuable and pertinent to our mission, especially the training we had on the Tactical Personnel System," said Staff Sgt. John Stymiest, 406th Human Resources Command.

Sergeant Stymiest and the 406th HRC's mission was to process Soldiers in and out of the DPC and properly maintain the manifest until the unit departed Germany.

The IMT's mission was to proceed through the DPC for three days in order to assess the unit's deployment capabilities and strengthen and validate certain applicable sections of its tactical standard operating procedures. The exercise assisted the IMT, made up of 38 active Guard Reserve Soldiers and emergency essential civilians, to prepare for rapid response and deployment

to a foreign consequence management mission.

The IMT key leaders received an exercise warning order to respond and deploy to an earthquake scenario exercise and report to the DPC to process and load personnel, vehicles and equipment pallets onto mock C-130 aircraft. This training provided an insight into what the unit would actually need in preparation for a real-world deployment.

Upon arrival at the DPC, the IMT moved into the personnel holding area before receiving an in-depth brief from DPC director Augustine Olive. Mr. Olive's team guided the unit on a quick visual run-through of each of the processing stations followed by a demonstration on the correct methods for palletizing and loading individual storage units in preparation for loading onto a C-130 aircraft.

As the 7th CSC completed the

DPC portion, equipment, vehicles and personnel redeployed back to Daenner Kaserne. The IMT wrapped up the exercise by conducting a series of after-action reviews to revise and refine its tactical deployment SOPs. The entire exercise and operation was a great experience for Soldiers and civilians alike. Going through each stage provided a perspective on where the IMT needed to focus for the next exercise or real-world mission.

"This training is making us a better and a more cohesive team," said Sgt. 1st Class Dwight Pitts, the 7th CSC maintenance NCO in charge.

The information gathered from this operation will help the 7th CSC as it continues to revise and refine its mission of rapid alert, mobilization and deployment of foreign consequence management, command and control, civil support and civil affairs capabilities.

completed pilot training in the United Kingdom in 1997 and is now an Algerian air force instructor for the C-130H, looked at the C-130J with a critical eye.

"It seems to me very good – very simple and automatic in the cockpit," he said.

While many of the current cadre of Algerian C-130 pilots and engineers were qualified through courses in the U.S., such as Undergraduate Pilot Training, Basic Flight Engineer Training and C-130 Flight Engineer Training, the Algerian air force has now developed a curriculum to train all aircrew members in-house.

"We do classroom and simulator training for pilots, flight engineers, loadmasters and maintenance members," said Lt. Col. Bahlouli Nouredine, a C-130 instructor flight engineer.

In addition, the Algerian air force participates in bilateral operational training events with the U.S. In 2003, two C-130s from the U.S. and two from Algeria conducted training in Southern Algeria.

"We'll do flight exchanges where we have our pilots in your aircraft and yours in ours," Colonel Bahlouli said, noting that the forces practiced low-level flights, airdrop and night drop operations.

While Algeria and the U.S. have been diplomatic friends and partners for many years, U.S. Ambassador to Algeria David Pearce said, "military cooperation has come a long way in the last year." This is especially important given Algeria's role in the region as a leader in counterterrorism efforts. The military can be a catalyst for cooperation, especially when engaging with Algeria as partners in supporting their counterterrorism efforts, Ambassador Pearce said.

"The United States has been and remains

committed to working with these governments (in the Sahel region) to help combat terrorism and to help ensure stability in Algeria and in the wider region," said U.S. Africa Command's Gen. William Ward during a visit to Algeria in November.

Fighting terrorism since the 1970s, Algeria brings much experience to the table in this area and has worked with several neighboring

governments to improve communications, logistics and overall interoperability, said Gen. Nour Eddine Mekri, director of the Direction des Relations Exterieures et de la Cooperation.

"Terrorists and organized crime are wrapped together," said Gen. Mekri in French to a translator. "To fight this, exchanging information between you and our military is very valuable."

General Ladnier agreed and reiterated Gen. Ward's commitment of support.

"We know terrorism is like a disease. It affects everything from economic development to future generations," he said. "We value our friendship with Algeria and want to be a good partner in that fight. We're here to listen and to ask how we can be helpful."

The engagement wrapped up with a media roundtable event held at the U.S. Embassy that was attended by reporters from six Algerian news outlets. Reporters queried General Ladnier on the purpose of his visit, the topics discussed with Algerian leaders and what he sees as the way forward for the budding relationship.

"The No. 1 thing we've learned about terrorism is that the terrorists talk and share techniques, and those techniques change every day," General Ladnier said. "That's why we're interested in learning from and working with Algeria, because like Algeria, we're interested in peace, security and economic development. We're in agreement with your leaders that we need to meet again and plan for future activities between our air forces."

# The four engine dive bomber

GenLt. Walther Weaver, the Luftwaffe's first chief of staff, was an advocate of a long-range strategic bomber. After his demand for the development of the previously discussed Ural bombers, he followed with a more ambitious requirement, the Bomber A, for an even faster and more modern long-range bomber.

In 1936, the Heinkel Company set to work on Bomber A, but before a prototype was built, Weaver was killed in a place crash and his successor instead changed the focus to dive bombers and twin-engine medium bombers.

Heinkel was allowed to continue with the project but on Nov. 5, 1937, Ernst Udet, chief of the Luftwaffe's development wing and the major proponent of the dive bomber, told Heinkel the bomber, now designated the He-177 "Grief" (Griffin), had to be able to perform 45 degree dive bombing attacks.

Heinkel knew a normal aircraft of this size would require 4,000 horsepower to meet its performance goals, and this meant – given the engines of the time – four engines. But it would be impossible to build a wing strong enough to support four engines in the high G pull out from a 45 degree dive bombing attack.

Heinkel's chief designer, Siegfried Gunter, thought he knew a way out. He had designed the Heinkel He-119 high-speed racer, which had a pair of Daimler Benz engines mechanically coupled together and mounted in a slim fuselage and driving a single propeller, making it look like a single engine aircraft.

Gunter modified the He-177 to have each nacelle carry two engines.

To avoid heavy and drag producing cooling radiators, he added an evaporative cooling system that ducted away hot water from the engines and fed it through pipes in the wing where it was cooled by the airflow then returned.

But the evaporative cooling system was quickly seen as inadequate and dropped in favor

of conventional radiators in each nacelle, which added significantly to the weight and drag.

On Nov. 9, 1939, the first prototype He-177 V1 made its first flight, and the first tests showed the four engine/two nacelle combination provided a substantial reduction in drag, making it possible to dive bomb as well as making the aircraft quite maneuverable.

However, the initial flight was terminated abruptly after only 12 minutes as a result of overheating engines, foreshadowing the problems that were to make the He-177 one of the worst aircraft of World War II.

To reduce drag, the engine nacelles had to have a small diameter, partially achieved by having a single central exhaust manifold between the two inner cylinder banks of the engines. Not surprisingly, this manifold became very hot and regularly caused the normal accumulation of oil in the nacelle to ignite. Adding to the problem was another concession to the small diameter nacelle – no firewall.

The crammed nacelle also had insufficient space for the fuel and oil lines, which resulted in kinks and leaky connections, and a poorly designed fuel pump that delivered extra fuel when the pilot throttled back, creating another fire hazard. The oil pump did not provide adequate lubrication and resulted in the disintegration of rod bearings, which then punctured the oil tanks and poured oil on to the hot exhaust pipe.

As if this was not enough, the design weight

skyrocketed. The large wing flaps cracked from the stress of dive bombing and need extensive strengthening, adding more weight, which required a redesign of the landing gear. The new design was so poor it took two hours to change

The first Grief squadron was sent to the Eastern Front, but on the He-177s first 13 missions, seven crashed in flames without any action attributable to the enemy. They were later withdrawn and informally dubbed "Luftwaffenfeuerzeug," or Luftwaffe's petrol lighter.

Other He-177s were sent to the west and suffered a similar fate.

On one of their first missions – a raid on London on the night of Feb. 13, 1944 – 13 He-177s took off but eight had to return to base because of overheating or burning engines.

By late 1944, modifications had been made to eliminate the engine fires and the He-177 performed some useful service as carriers of anti-ship missiles. However, it was too late to have an impact on the war.

# YoAFF: Program offers free financial aid to military spouses

The Military Spouse Career Advancement Accounts program, sponsored by the Office of the Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Military Community & Family Policy, provides up to \$6,000 of financial assistance to military spouses pursuing licenses, certificates, credentials or degree programs leading to employment in portable career fields.

MyCAA is a Department of Defense initiative that provides a lifetime benefit of up to \$6,000 of financial assistance to military spouses. MyCAA pays tuition for education and training courses, and professional licenses, certifications and credentials. This includes state certifications for teachers, medical professionals and other occupations requiring recognized certifications; licensing exams and related prep courses; continuing education unit classes, including those offered through professional associations; and degree programs leading to employment in portable career fields. MyCAA also pays for high school completion courses, GED tests and English as a second language classes.

*Eligibility:* Spouses of DOD active-duty members and activated members of the National Guard and Reserve components who are on Title 10 orders are eligible to receive MyCAA financial assistance.

Getting started: Eligible spouses can establish a MyCAA account by visiting the MyCAA Web site at https://aiportal.acc.af.mil/mycaa. Once spouse profile information is provided, MyCAA will verify spouse DEERS benefit eligibility. Eligible spouses will be allowed to create their career and training plan and request financial assistance when they are within 30 days of course start dates. Additionally, spouses are responsible for applying to their selected school or program and enrolling in each course included in their approved MyCAA career and training plan.

#### Military spouses can help themselves:

- Visit www.careeronestop.org to explore portable career fields and find schools that have programs of study leading to licenses, certificates and degrees.
- Find a school in the MyCAA Web site (https://aiportal.acc.af.mil/mycaa) by using the school search function. If the desired school is not listed, follow the directions shown at the end of the school search
- Establish and manage their MyCAA account at https://aiportal.acc.af.mil/mycaa, use MyCAA resources to create a career and training plan and apply for financial assistance.

#### School officials can help spouses:

- Select a program of study and sources of exams for licenses and certificates.
- Select courses to include in their MyCAA career and training plan.
- Validate school and course information on the approved financial assistance request prior to course start dates to avoid billing problems.
- Submit grades or evidence of course completion to MyCAA within 60 days of course end dates.

### MyCAA career and education consultants (1-800-342-9647) can help spouses:

- Explore career interests, evaluate school options and compare programs of study, including costs.

meet with high-level Afghan officials."

Without these meetings, the generals would not be able to do their job, Sergeant Heilman added.

"These meetings were crucial to building and training the Afghan Security Forces," he added. "Due to the nature of conversation within the trucks, each member of my team had to be mature and understand what was said in the trucks was not to leave the truck. Having the general officers' trust was a very important part of what my team did."

And, protecting the generals was not always the safest task.

"While deployed, we witnessed suicide vehicle-borne improvised explosive devices, vehicle-borne improvised explosive devices and shoot-outs," Sergeant Heilman said. "It was our responsibility to know and understand the daily intel to avoid these situations."

These close experiences also made the members think of the bigger picture of life

"My most memorable experience was feeling the vibration of a SVBIED that targeted an Afghan official," Sergeant Heilman said. "The screams and of the Afghan people that were affected by the explosive will remain with me forever and really puts life into perspective. You have to understand how precious life is and enjoy every minute of it."

To get through those hard times during the deployment, the members turned to each other.

"Our team grew very tight over the past seven months," Sergeant Heilman said. "We lived together, worked together, played together, but most importantly, we protected each other. It was truly an honor for me to serve with each and every member of my team."

# New gate enhances quality of life on Ramstein

ase personnel using the east gate on Ramstein as their primary entry and exit points were able to return to their normal traffic routes after the gate reopened Jan. 22.

The completion of the east gate construction ended almost two years of on-going entry point construction on the base.

And though the gate certainly looks more appealing, the renovations weren't about style, they were made to support the gate guards working around the clock to ensure base safety.

Prior to construction, gate guards were victims of the weather for long hours at a time. Improving the quality of their working conditions was crucial for their morale, said Andreas H. May, 86th Civil Engineer Squadron program flight deputy chief

"A short term inconvenience was necessary to greatly improve the quality of life for personnel who perform this vital force protection function, ultimately making us all more secure." the deputy chief said.

Mr. May said the project was intended to serve dual purposes. First, was providing protection from the elements by building a canopy structure over the entire width of the east gate. Second, was the renovation of the guard house including the restrooms, heating systems and the lobby.

During construction, security forces members had to work out of two temporary gates that were not as efficient in handling the rush-hour traffic in the mornings or evenings, said Capt. Nicole Schatz, 86th Security Forces Squadron operations officer. They were out in the elements more, since the temporary facilities did not have all the amenities as the east gate.

"The troops did an outstanding job for what they had to work with. Moving into a temporary gate that was smaller wasn't the ideal situation," the captain said. "Shutting down the east gate completely allowed the contractors to work without traffic. If we hadn't, the construction project would have taken longer and would have caused more traffic issues."

Staying on track to complete the mission was the focus of the security forces members, but for the contractors, their focus was on working on the gate to get base security back up to par.

"Almost from start to finish, the construction contractor stayed on schedule until late December when bad weather delayed the completion of the east entry-control point for about a month," Mr. May said. "Fortunately, an extended break in the cold and snowy weather allowed the contractor to finish essential work before the opening in January."

Only minor list items remain for the completion of the upgrade. Construction will resume later this spring when weather improves and will not affect gate operations or traffic flow

The minor inconveniences experienced by the KMC during all of the gate and road projects over the last two years is a small price to pay when compared to the quality of life improvements for security forces and the overall improvements of the traffic flow in, out and through Ramstein, Mr. May said.

# Reception center welcomes newcomers to Europe

WIESBADEN, Germany — They say first impressions are the truest, and members of the U.S. military's Frankfurt Gateway Reception Center at the Frankfurt Airport take that saying to heart.

"Our motto is world-class reception, and that's what we strive to provide through excellent customer service," said 1st Lt. Jacqueline Wood, executive officer for the reception center, which is part of 21st Theater Sustainment Command's Human Resources Sustainment Center-Europe.

When Soldiers and families come through the arrival gates at Frankfurt Airport, signs and liaison NCOs are on hand to make sure they are greeted and helped on their way to their destinations.

A team of 30 Soldiers and civilians work together to accomplish this mission at the Frankfurt Airport. With offices located in the Sheraton Hotel, Gateway Reception Center staff members are constantly on the move between the two airline terminals meeting arriving flights (about 42 daily), checking on those in the dedicated waiting areas in Terminal 1 and in the center, providing welcome briefings and arranging for any special circumstances such as overnight accommodations in the event of inclement weather or delayed transportation.

"We go above and beyond our duties to make sure Soldiers and families are taken care of from the moment they arrive until they make it to their final destination," said Sgt. Maj. Mike Fuller. "We try to do everything we can to make this the best first impression for Soldiers and families new to Europe."

Roughly 800 Soldiers a month pass through the reception facility with that number surging to between 1,100 and 1,400 during peak times. Along with those Soldiers come thousands of bags, family members and pets.


Once the servicemember arrives at the airport, in the interest of safety and fiscal responsibility, they are required to use the sponsorship buses. The only exceptions are those servicemembers in the grades E9, chief warrant officer 5, O5 and above who may be released to their sponsors.

"A lot of times you get people who are really upset because they drove all the way from Bamberg or Grafenwöhr to pick up people, only to find that they are required to take the sponsorship bus," Lieutenant Wood said. "Really, the buses are the safest way to go, and sponsors could be doing something a lot more productive for their unit back at their installation. Plus the buses cut down on fuel and vehicle use."

The reception experts are also there to offer advice to travelers, such as not traveling in uniform for force protection reasons and making sure that they don't arrive at the airport on weekends or holidays.

Operations Specialist Richard Williams said ID cardholders can use the free sponsorship busses on a space available basis when traveling on leave to get to and from flights.

In observance of Black History Month, the Kaiserslautern African American Heritage Committee will sign a proclamation with Brig. Gen. Mark Dillion, 86th Airlift Wing and KMC commander.

This year's national Black History Month theme is "The History of Black Economic Empowerment."

The need for economic development has been a central element of black life. After

centuries of unrequited toil as slaves, African Americans gained their freedom and found themselves in the struggle to make a living. The chains were gone, but racism was everywhere. Black codes often prevented blacks from owning land in towns and cities, and in the countryside they were often denied the opportunity to purchase land. Organized labor shut their doors to their brethren, and even

the white philanthropist who funded black schools denied them employment opportunities once educated.

In the South, whites sought to ensure blacks would only be sharecroppers and day laborers, and in the North, whites sought to keep them as unskilled labor.

Pushing against the odds, African Americans became landowners, skilled workers, small businessmen and women, professionals and ministers.

In the Jim Crow economy, they started insurance companies, vocational schools, teachers' colleges, cosmetic firms, banks, newspapers and hospitals. To fight exclusion from the economy, they started their

own unions and professional associations. In an age when individuals proved unable to counter industrialization alone, they preached racial or collective uplift rather than individual self-reliance.

The late-19th and early 20th centuries witnessed an unprecedented degree of racial solidarity and organization.

In 1910, a group of dedicated reformers, black and white, gathered to create an

organization to address the needs of African Americans as they migrated to U.S. cities. The organization they created a century ago became what we all know as the National Urban League.

For a century, they have struggled to open the doors of opportunity for successive generations, engaging the challenges of each age. The KAAHC celebrates the centennial of the National

Urban League by exploring racial uplift and black economic development in the 20th century.



# AF returns enlisted high year tenure to standards

**WASHINGTON** — Air Force manpower and personnel officials recently announced a return of enlisted high year of tenure limits to their pre-2003 levels.

"We've considered returning HYT limits to their normal levels for several years. Now that our Air Force end strength is stabilizing, it is an appropriate time to return back to the pre-2003 levels," said Tom Voegtle, chief of the retirements and separations policy branch at the Pentagon.

High year of tenure is the maximum years of service a member may remain on active duty in relation to his or her enlisted grade.

The HYT for senior master sergeant, master sergeant, technical sergeant and senior Airman will return to 26, 24, 22 and 10 years, respectively. The HYT limits for both chief master sergeant (30 years) and staff sergeant (20 years) will remain the same since they were not raised in 2003, Mr. Voegtle said.

The change will initially affect approximately 2,500 Airmen – 500 senior Airmen, 400 technical

sergeants, 1,200 master sergeants and 400 senior master sergeants.

The new HYT effective date for master sergeant is April 1, 2011; for technical sergeant, Aug. 1, 2011; and, for senior Airmen, Sept. 1, 2011. The effective date for senior master sergeant is Jan. 1, 2012. This timeline provides Airmen additional opportunities to compete for promotion or plan for separation or retirement from active duty.

All Airmen who separate due to HYT will receive involuntary separation pay.

Technical, master and senior master sergeants may apply for full retirement if leaving active duty due to reaching their HYT just as they would under existing policy.

While the new HYT is applicable now, Airmen who will be "over" their HYT as the policy is normalized will be allowed to remain on active duty until no later than the effective date for their corresponding grades.

An Airman's total active federal military service date will determine whether he or she is under the old or new HYT limit. For example, a senior Airman whose TAFMSD is Aug. 31, 2001, or earlier would separate under his or her original HYT date or Sept. 1, 2011, whichever comes first. If the senior Airman's TAFMSD date is after Aug. 31, 2001, that Airman's date would be adjusted to the new 10-year limit. In other words, the Airman will now be required to separate at the 10-year point rather than the 12-year point if he or she is not promoted to staff sergeant.

Airmen overseas who will reach HYT before they are scheduled to return will receive new dates in accordance with the revised policy, Mr. Voegtle said. Also, deployed Airmen and those soon to deploy who are affected by the policy change will return no later than 30 days prior to their new HYT date.

The new HYT requirements will not affect the Post-9/11 G.I. Bill. Airmen opting to transfer their Post-9/11 G.I. Bill benefits to family members will still be able to transfer these benefits even if their new HYT dates prevent them from complet-

ing the required active-duty service commitments.

Extensions of HYT are still applicable under existing guidelines. These include reasons such as extreme personal hardship or when an extension is clearly in the best interest of the Air Force, Mr. Voegtle said

This change to policy will not affect Air Force Reserve or Air National Guard members.

The AF has a long-standing tradition of taking care of its people, and will continue this tradition through this process and beyond, Mr. Voegtle said.

"There will be no change in retirement or separation pay benefits, and the Air Force is committed to providing our Airmen and their families with an open and transparent process," he added.

## Ramstein hosts annual Fasching parade

Ramstein-Miesenbach's highlight for this Fasching season will be its annual parade through the city Tuesday afternoon. The Bruchkatze Carnival Association sponsors the traditional parade, which is the biggest in the Westpfalz area with more than 1,600 participants.

"We got registrations from 18 carnival associations, seven music groups, 24 walking groups and 22 floats," said Hartmut Schäffner, chief of the parade committee. "We as organizers are proud to be able to present such a great parade with

participants who spent all their leisure time to create wonderful costumes and unique floats."

Ramstein-Miesenbach's sister city Maxéville, France, will send a float and a walking group of about 50 people.

The KMC is represented by about 250 people in walking groups and one float. The U.S. Air Forces in Europe Band will participate with 40 to 50 musicians.

"We received registrations for the Ramstein, Sembach and Vogelweh Girl Scouts, Cub Scout Pack 156 and the Ramstein High School Step Team," said Elke Sittel from the 86th Airlift Wing Host Nation Office. "The 86th Construction

and Training Squadron will join the parade on a truck with 20 people wearing Halloween masks."

More than 48,000 promotion items including candies will be tossed to the 30,000 to 50,000 spectators. The almost two-hour long parade starts at 2 p.m. on Stutzenflurstrasse and August-Süssdorf-Strasse. Food and beverage booths will be placed throughout the 3.25 kilometer route.

Residents along the route are asked to decorate their houses to support the celebration. Organizers ask parents to watch their kids, and for safety reasons, spectators shouldn't get too close to the floats.

"I would also like to emphasize the fact that the Bruchkatze Carnival Association sponsors, organizes and finances the parade," Mr. Schäffner said. "The sale of parade buttons for €2 from vendors on the street help us to pay the event."

After the parade, the party will continue at the Haus des Bürgers. Spectators can get free admission to the party with the buttons.

"Local institutions such as Polizei, the volunteer fire brigade, German Red Cross, office of public order and military police support us each year and help to make the event a success," Mr. Schäffner said.

A Fasching carnival with a merry-goround and activity booths will be set up from Sunday through Tuesday on Marktplatz. The center of Ramstein-Miesenbach will be closed Tuesday to motorized vehicles from noon to 6 p.m., and Bahnhofstrassse will be closed until 8 p.m.

"I hope a lot of people will come to join us for this fun-filled event," Mr. Schäffner said. "Ralau!" (the official Fasching shout in Ramstein-Miesenbach).





### Prayer breakfast offers chance to face winter, fear together

hile spring, summer and fall offer people different signs of hope, life and happiness, winter ushers in images of gloominess, cold and, above all, death, said Chaplain (Col.) # FASCHING PARADES ON UNTIL TUESDAY

Fasching, Germany's "crazy season," continues through Tuesday with masquerade balls, dances, children's parties and funny sessions.

Special Fasching highlights are the Rose Monday parades. The most famous parades are

those leading through the main Fasching cities of Mainz, Köln and Düsseldorf. Spectators from Germany and throughout Europe will come to these cities to watch the annual spectacle with decorated floats, bands, dancing and marching groups. Participants in vehicles will throw out candy or hand out drinks to the crowds along the streets. It is traditional for revelers to sing, sway and dance during the five-hour parades, which all start at 11:11 a.m.

The official Fasching greeting in Köln and Düsseldorf is "Alaaf," and in Mainz it's "Helau."

The day is called Rose

Monday because the organization committee of the Köln parade, which was founded in 1824, had its general membership meetings on Monday after the so-called Rose Sunday, also known as mid-Lent Sunday or Laetare Sunday. Originally, this day was the third Sunday before Easter. Since the 11th century, the pope dedicated a golden rose to a deserved personality that day. Since 1830, the day was called Rose Monday.

In order not to compete with the big Rose Monday parades, Ramstein-Miesenbach, Zweibrücken and

Grünstadt have their parades at 2 p.m. on Shrove Tuesday. Other parades in the Pfalz are held at 2 p.m. Saturday in Frankenthal and 2 p.m. Sunday in Linden, Trippstadt, Dahn and Rodalben. The parade in Ludwigshafen starts at 1:11 p.m. Sunday.

Many towns offer outdoor Fasching events on Shrove Tuesday. Stages will be put up, where local carnival associations will entertain visitors with presentations by their dance groups and members holding funny speeches. Often the council members of the carnival associations invite prominent personalities of the town including the mayor to

come on stage to make fun of them.

hall). The local Fasching association, KVK, will present its Fasching princess, Alexandra, dancing groups and other members. The official shout is "Kalau."

In most German states, children don't have school on Shrove Tuesday. And usually, people who work take off in the early afternoon. In most cases, employers allow them to do so, and stores, banks and official institutions close anyhow at 1 or 2 p.m. Tuesday.

Ash Wednesday will end the crazy season. Carnival association members and party-goers will meet one more time for their traditional "Heringsessen," or the eating of herring. Herring is supposed to help ease hangovers. Also on Ash Wednesday, Lent, a 40-day fasting period for Roman Catholics, starts.

# SPALENTINE'S SPAY A day for lovers, friends

Red hearts used decoration as items in department stores, flower shops, candy stores, bakeries and window displays signal Valentine's Day is just around the corner. Sunday is the day for lovers and a day of friendship.

In many countries around the world, Valentine's Day is celebrated and observed Feb. 14. Husbands and wives, girl-friends and boyfriends exchange flowers, cards and gifts, and have romantic dinners.

Also, dear ones such as parents, grandparents, relatives and good friends are included in the custom to show they are loved and appreciated.

Valentine cards have a long tradition. Legend says the Duke of Orleans, while in prison in the Tower of London in 1415, kept sending love letters to his spouse, and not only on Feb. 14. Ever since, he has been looked at as the founder of valentines.

In the 17th century, author Samuel Pepys from London revived this tradition of writing a love letter to his wife on Feb. 14. She was so thrilled about that and in turn gave him flowers. The British noble society took over the tradition of giving flowers and sending love notes soon after, and it was spread through England and France. In the 18th century, people in love started to send romantic greeting cards. In Germany, recognition of Valentine's Day started in the 1950s when American Soldiers brought the British tradition to

Germany.
The Greeting
Card Association
estimates that worldwide 1 billion Valentine's
Day cards are sent each year,
making it the second largest cardsending day, next to Christmas.

According to another legend, the custom of giving flowers goes back to ancient Rome, where a friendly priest named Valentine gave advice to young people, in particular regarding marriage. He did this despite Emperor Claudius' prohibition. Claudius did not want his legionaries to get - according to Christian customs – tied to wives and houses. But Valentine was looking for lovers, found them and married them. He passed out flowers to young couples who were walking by the garden of his monastery and asked the men to stay at home rather than go out to battle. One day, Emperor Claudius wanted to meet Valentine and find out about his wisdom. The emperor requested Valentine to believe in Roman gods again.
Then they would be friends.

But the priest told him that he never would ask him to do so if he knew about the glory of God and his son Christ. During his visit with Claudius, a council member asked Valentine what he thought of the Roman gods. Valentine answered that they are demons. The council immediately requested the blasphemer's death.

During a delay Valentine asked for, he impressed the emperor with the truth of Christian belief. Claudius was deeply touched, but when Rome's governor said Valentine was a magician, Claudius feared a revolt by his people and passed the priest on to Asterius, a judge, to decide on his fate. While standing in front of the judge, Valentine performed a miracle. He made the judge's blind daughter see again by praying and

laying one of his hands on her. Asterius and his family were later baptized. But because their new

Christian belief
was counter to
Roman religion,
they were tortured and killed.
Rome's governor also decided to torture
Valentine and
behead him on
Feb. 14, 269.

Before he was killed, many young people visited him in jail.

Also, one jail guard's daughter came to see him several times. She helped him to keep his spirits up and told him he did the right thing by ignoring the emperor and going ahead with the secret messages.

On the day he was to die, he left a note thanking the girl for her friendship and loyalty. He signed it with "Love from your Valentine." That might have started the custom of exchanging love messages on Feb. 14.

About 100 years after Valentine's death, he was canonized. In 1550, in memory of Valentine, a memorial chapel was built in St. Valentin in South Tyrol, Austria, where visitors can admire a wooden statue of the saint. Since Valentine's martyr death, Feb. 14 is observed as day of love. In former times, the night before Feb. 14, women tied laurel leaves to the four tips of their pillows. This was supposed to be a guarantee for dreaming of their true love. People also believed a woman would marry the man she would see first in front of her house on Valentine's Day. This was enough reason for a young man to be out early in the morning and to reassure the feeling of his beloved one with a bouquet of flowers.

#### Mouth guards protect your smile

It's easy to take some things for granted until they're suddenly gone.

Have you ever thought about how it would feel if you lost one or two of your front teeth? You'd probably avoid smiling. It would be uncomfortable talking with someone face-to-face. It wouldn't be easy pronouncing certain words. And how about eating an apple? Until your teeth are gone, you might not miss them.

Each year, thousands of teens get hurt on the playing field, the basketball court, or while skate-boarding, biking or during other activities. Blows to the face in nearly every sport can injure your teeth, lips, cheeks and tongue.

A properly fitted mouth guard, or mouth protector, is an important piece of athletic gear that can protect your teeth and smile. You may have seen them used in contact sports, such as football, boxing and ice hockey.

But you don't have to be on the football field to benefit from a mouth guard. New findings in sports dentistry show that even in non-contact sports such as gymnastics, roller blading and field hockey, mouth guards help protect teeth. Many experts recommend that a mouth guard be worn for any recreational activity that poses a risk of injury to the mouth.

There are three types of mouth guards: The ready-made, or stock, mouth guard; the mouth-formed – boil and bite – mouth guard; and the custom-made mouth guard made by your dentist. The most effective mouth guard should have several features: it should be resilient, tear-resistant and comfortable. It should fit properly, be durable and easy to clean and not restrict your speech or breathing.

Generally, a mouth guard covers only the upper teeth, but in some cases the dentist will instead make a mouth guard for the lower teeth. Your dentist can suggest the right mouth guard for you.

Here are some suggestions for taking good care of your mouth guard:

- Before and after each use, rinse it with cold water and clean it with a toothbrush.
- When it's not used, place your mouth guard in a firm, perforated container. This permits air circulation and helps prevent damage.
- Avoid high temperatures, such as hot water, hot surfaces or direct sunlight, which can distort the mouth guard.
- Check it for tears, holes and poor fit. A mouth guard that's torn or in bad shape can irritate your mouth and lessen the amount of protection it provides.
- Have regular dental checkups and bring your mouth guard along so the dentist can make sure it's still in good condition.
- Don't take your teeth for granted. Protect your smile with a mouth guard.

#### Oral piercings not as safe as you think

Piercing, like tattooing, is just one of today's popular forms of body art and self-expression. Piercing may seem daring, cool and totally safe, but piercing the tongue, lips, cheeks or uvula (the tiny tissue that hangs at the back of the throat) is not as safe as some would have you believe. That's because the mouth's moist environment – home to huge amounts of breeding bacteria – is an ideal place for infection.

An oral piercing can interfere with speech,

chewing or swallowing. That may seem like a mere inconvenience until you consider that it may also cause: excessive drooling, infection, pain and swelling, chipped or cracked teeth, injuries to the gums, damage to fillings, increased saliva flow, hypersensitivity to metals, scar tissue and nerve damage.

These harmful effects can happen during the piercing, soon after or even long after the procedure

An infection can quickly become life threatening if it's not treated promptly. For example, oral piercings carry a potential risk of endocarditis, an inflammation of the heart valves or tissues. Bacteria can enter the bloodstream through the piercing site in the mouth and travel to the heart, where it can colonize on heart abnormalities. This is a risk for people with heart conditions and, in the worst of cases, results in death.

After a piercing the tongue may swell. There have been reports of swelling serious enough to block the airway. And it's very possible to puncture a nerve during a tongue piercing. If this happens, you may experience a numb tongue – nerve damage that is sometimes temporary, but can be permanent. The injured nerve may affect your sense of taste or how you move your mouth. And damage to the tongue's blood vessels can cause serious blood loss.

In addition, piercing jewelry can sometimes cause allergic responses to the pierced site. The jewelry can even get in the way of dental care by blocking X-rays.

Don't pierce on a whim. The piercing will be an added responsibility to your life, requiring constant attention and upkeep. Talk to your dentist for more information.

# COMPETITION CHALLENGES KMC MEMBERS TO LOSE WEIGHT, GET HEALTHY

Editor's note: This is part one of a three-part series on the Biggest Loser Competition and the KMC members who are working to achieve a better lifestyle while losing weight.

The fourth annual Biggest Loser Challenge kicked off on Ramstein Jan. 11 with the first round of weighins and fitness assessments.

"The biggest loser is a competition for individuals motivated to lose weight themselves who have the motivation not only from within but also from their peers, families and work colleagues," said Edward Wilson, 86th Services Squadron fitness specialist. "It is a challenge. The trainers involved and the health classes offered through the supporting units on base are there to help and support these individuals in bettering their lifestyle and health."

Six participants were selected this year to work out with a Cooper Institute certified professional trainer. The services each contestant receives in this competition for free

would cost thousands of dollars off base, Mr. Wilson said.

"In comparison to what we offer them here for free, if you were to pay for the services we are offering them, it's more than an \$8,000 value per month," he said. "So, we're giving them \$24,000 worth of services for three months during this competition for free."

Competitors will meet for physical

training sessions with their trainers at least three times a week and are weighed-in and taped once a week. On top of the training, each person is also given a personal diet plan from a Ramstein Health and Wellness Center dietician.

For one participant, her workout consists of 35 minutes of strength and 40 minutes of cardio.

"Each day, we focus on upper



body, lower body or chest," said Naomi Voss, military spouse, stepmother of two girls and mother of two young boys, ages 22 months and 3 months.

So far, Mrs. Voss said she's lost a total of 6 ½ pounds with the Biggest Loser. Her short-term goal is to drop a size by summer, and her long-term goal is to get back into a size 10. No matter how much weight she loses,

she said health is her driving force.

"I want to be healthy for my family," she said. "I also need my confidence back, and I just can't get back to being me until I feel good about the way I look again."

And this was exactly what Mrs. Voss tried to convey in the essay she submitted to be a participant.

"I want to be full of energy when I get up in the mornings and be able to

get up and down off the ground with my boys with ease," she wrote in her essay. "The thing I don't want to be is the mom whose kids are embarrassed to be seen with. I don't want my kids to get teased because of me. I want them to be proud of me."

And that is what the trainers for the Biggest Loser are trying to help her and the other participants achieve, but in a safe manner.

"Our main goal is the safety in losing weight, so it doesn't come back, and they don't regress after the competition," Mr. Wilson said, adding that the competition was meant to help participants reach their goals through "better lifestyle habits, diet and physical activities" and not by adding supplements to their diets to increase weight loss.

Along the way, participants have several incentives. Mr. Wilson said several sponsors, both on and off base, have donated prizes to the competition. Prizes will be given for weekly achievements, and the contestant who loses the most weight and inches at the end of the competition will receive exercise equipment. The competition will last through the end of March.
